The issue of salvation has been challenging for people to reconcile, specifically the paradox concerning God's sovereignty and human responsibility. Paul addresses this in Philippians 2:12-13.

What are some Scriptures that confirm God as the active agent in our salvation? What about in the salvific work of sanctification?

What are some Scriptures that confirm human responsibility in salvation? What about the salvific work of sanctification?

Do these Scriptures find themselves at odds with one another? How do they complement each other?
