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# 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 1:1-3

Paul call's the Christians in the church in Corinth "saints" and says that they've been "sanctified," even though there are many doctrinal and moral corrections needed.

How do you understand "positional holiness" versus "practical holiness"? Was there clarity in the sermon?

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Is it helpful to understand key differences between "who I am" versus "what I do"? How does grace cover the gap?

James teaches that we aren't saved BY good works but that we are saved TO good works.

How does that truth shape your understanding of sanctification?
