Acts 20:1-17

Acts 20 gives us wonderful insights to the intentionality of the first century church. In fact, we get a glimpse at the earliest recorded Christian worship gathering.

Points found in our text concerning the role of the church:

1. The church is designed to edify the saints (vs 1-2)
2. The church gives much exhortation with the Word of God (vs 1-2)
3. The church is generous (vs 3-6)
4. The church gathered on Sundays (vs 7)
5. The church is hospitable (vs 7-8)
6. The church gathers to break bread (vs 7)
7. The church experienced the Spirit of God (vs 7-17)

In seeing the functioning of the early church, what similarities do you see in our church today? What differences do you see?

Do you sense intentional worship elements in our church on Sundays? Explain what they are and why they are practiced.

Jesus is the center of all elements of the first century worship. Why is that important? Why is it still important today?

Critical to every piece of church liturgy is the need for the Spirit of God to be present and working in the worship gathering.
