Acts 28:1-31

There are two sections in chapter 28 that conclude Paul's journey to Rome. Both were ordained by God and bridge the story of Acts to the rest of redemptive history.

Paul and his companions meet natives on the island of Malta. What was their behavior toward the sailors? How is the moral law of God demonstrated in the hearts of pagans?

Paul demonstrates humble leadership on the ship, but also on the island? How? And what can we learn?

Tradition teaches that a church was started on Malta and Syracuse during this time. How does Paul demonstrate the ability to have a gospel impact even in the midst of trials? What can we glean from that truth?

Paul gets to Rome and has the chance to teach the Jewish leaders there. He teaches of the Kingdom of God through the Law of Moses and from the Prophets.

How does that gospel presentation line up with the gospel presentation today? Has anything changed?

How does the whole Bible show the gospel of salvation? What is the Kingdom of God and how does it compare to the kingdom of the world?
