Acts 22:30-23:11

Paul's encounter with the Sanhedrin reveals the clarity of conscience that he has experienced throughout his life. It gives us a great understanding of how the human conscience is swayed by personal worldviews.

What we feel is right and wrong is dependent on how our conscience guides. How do you believe Scripture influences your conscience?

Can you see how your worldview shapes your understanding of morality? How does your understanding of morality compare in a secular worldview versus a biblical worldview?

"Unless I am convinced by sacred Scripture or by evident reason, I cannot recant. For my conscience is neither right nor safe."- Martin Luther when asked to revoke his convictions by Emperor Charles.

What does it mean to have your conscience "held captive" by the Word of God?

Paul stood before the Sanhedrin, but even the Sadducees and Pharisees were divided on the issue of the resurrection. Is it clear that the resurrection of Jesus is what all of Christianity hinges on? Do you realize how that detail is what solidifies the gospel?
