# Philippians 2:9-11

Last week we covered Philippians 2:5-8, where we saw the 8 ways that Christ displays humility by "lowering" himself.

This week we'll finish going over the Creed of Christ and cover verses 9-11. In these verses, we will see four aspects of the Father's exaltation of the Son. These are: 1. The Source

- 2. The Title
- 3. The Response
- 4. The Purpose

1. What does it mean that this passage should stimulate "adoration and emulation"?

2. What would happen in our relationships if we lived out Philippians 2:5–11?

3. How is Jesus' leadership model different from a worldly view of leadership? How can you put this type of life into practice today?4. How is the exaltation of Christ displayed in this passage?5. Why is the exaltation of Christ vital for you today?

6. The passage ends by saying that Christ's work was done "to the glory of God the Father." how does this move you? Is your great aim to live a humble, others-oriented life for the glory of the Father through Jesus? Pray for a deeper desire to live for God's glory by following Christ's example.

7. What are the first thoughts that come to your mind when you realize that you will one day be exalted?
