Acts 18:18-28

Paul has found encouragement and is motivated to complete his second missionary journey. Our text shows some of his religious heritage practices, his reward of patience toward Ephesus, and great examples of gospel multiplication.

Paul took a vow with God which details more his appreciation for his Jewish heritage, not necessarily for legalistic submission. Do you have examples of religious practices that we practice today that aren't prescribed in Scripture? What are the values in practicing them?

Paul wanted to go to Ephesus early in his journey but the Spirit forbade him. Now he makes his way there. Do you see how patience and submission to the Lord pays gospel dividends? Can you recall the stories of redemption from the places the Spirit took Paul instead of Ephesus?

Apollos shows up in Ephesus and has great zeal and education, but not the right gospel message. Aquila and Priscilla graciously teach and disciple him.

Do you see the danger in having SOME truth but not the COMPLETE truth regarding Jesus? The Bible without appropriate context can lead to false teaching.

Paul continues to leave his disciples behind to lead the churches that he is establishing. How is discipleship practiced in our church today in a way that reflects this model?
