1st Corinthians 9:15-27

We are expected to abandon our freedoms if it means we can be a more effective witness of the Gospel. Paul shares these convictions in this section of the text.

What do you think Paul means when he says he's become "all things to all people..."?

Have you abandoned freedoms to become a more effective witness of the Gospel? What are some examples?

Identify somebody that you know that you've made pre-conceived opinions of that you've realized later were wrong. Are there people in your life that you can admit you've created an opinion of that you've not yet gotten to know truly?

The Gospel is free, and Paul was willing to abandon financial gain so that people could see the Good News in an unadulterated way. Are these sacrifices you've been willing to make?

Consider your 1 (the person you identified in early March as being the 1 person you want to receive faith). Have you pursued them? Have you been sacrificial in the way that you show them Jesus?
