Acts 25:13-26:32

The gospel of Jesus brings people from darkness into light. This is the message of Paul before King Agrippa, and it's been the message of Christians for all of church history.

Paul's defense has been a personal testimony of redemption. He's told them three key details:

- 1. Look who I was
- 2. Look what Jesus did
- 3. Look who I am now

Plugging this into your own testimony, how does that story look for you? How does your life today compare to before conversion?

The detail that has Paul on trial is his teaching on the resurrection of Jesus. How does the resurrection change the redemption narrative? How does the resurrection of your soul change your redemption narrative?

The Scriptures are clear that our righteousness are filthy rags. How does humility help us realize our very BEST is soiled with sin? How does humility help us realize the scope of what Jesus has done for us at salvation?

Paul reminds the listeners that his entire testimony testifies of the teachings of the Law and Prophets. The Word became Life.

Do you see culture accepting the Bible only when it fits their narrative? How has that played out?
