ADVENT PART 4: Promises Fulfilled

God has given us His promises throughout time. These promises have naturally created a longing in us to be apart of something bigger than what we are currently living in. The culmination of these promises were fulfilled at the birth of Jesus.

Have you been able to identify the misplaced longings you've experienced? Has this teaching series helped you reconcile those?

Can you think of practical ways that you've tried to solve your longings? Can you determine that those ways aren't satisfactory?

Mary's song reveals some really important truths that help us with our longings. Primarily the importance of walking in humility in the realization that Christ satisfies, and not walking in self-righteousness believing that WE can satisfy.

We are half-hearted creatures, fooling about with drink and sex and ambition when infinite joy is offered to us, like an ignorant child who wants to go on making mud pies in a slum because he cannot imagine what is meant by the offer of a holiday at the sea.
