Luke 23:26-32

The road to Golgotha sovereignly included many different types of people, all impacted eternally by the Messiah. Our text today reveals the providential power of the Father.

It was established before the foundation of the world that the Lamb would be slain. Do you see how necessary the journey to Calvary was?

Simon of Cyrene helped by carrying the cross of Jesus as our Lord's body was battered. Does this detail bring any more reverence and appreciation for what Jesus endured on your behalf? GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

The religious leaders and soldiers thought they were leading Jesus to the place that will bring Him death. In reality, they are leading Jesus to a place that will bring us life.

Simon of Cyrene was a bystander in the crowd. But the impact of his encounter with Jesus led him to become a believer and ultimately leave a significant impact in first-century Christianity. Does this reveal to you the level of God's providential power?

Think of all of the people that Jesus saved (either physically or spiritually) while, simultaneously, not saving Himself. What level of undeserved grace is that?
