# Luke 22:54-62

The disciples had many moments of growth that displayed faith, and many moments of disappointment that displayed what seemed like a lack of faith. None was greater than the denials of Peter in Luke 22.

Peter displayed over-confidence several times when he told the Lord that he wouldn't betray him. Yet he did. Can you think of times when you've betrayed our Lord? Have you ever betrayed Him in ways that surprised you later?

It took only a menial maid to fell the chief of the Twelve. Gone were all his high and heroic protestations to Jesus, gone all the spurious courage from his heart and from the hand that had snatched out the sword in Gethsemane. Here stands the arrant coward who is unable to confess his heavenly Lord and cringes in lying denial.- R.C.H Lenski

GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKI

Except, Peter denying Jesus and then fleeing isn't the end of the story. The Lord restores Peter after His resurrection. What does this say about the grace and mercy of Jesus? Think of examples of how His grace and mercy covered has been displayed in you.

Peter experienced one of the lowest moments in human history, by his own doing. Yet he became a key piece to the establishment of the local church. Does this show you our God is a God of second chances?

Jesus promised Peter that he'd be restored (Luke 22:32). And this was while knowing that He'd deny Jesus. Does this affirm the unconditional love of Christ that isn't depending on reciprocity?
