1st Corinthians 11:2-16

There is a creative order to all things, and this includes relationships and worship. Paul unpacks this more deeply in our text today.

How have you seen creative order abused in the culture? What about in the church?

Do you find biblical teachings on gender distinctions challenging to affirm? How has your worldview influenced this?

How can relational order between husbands and wives best reflect relational order in the Trinity? How has the church misunderstood or mistaught these truths?

Concerning appearance and practice, do you find gender roles and appearance to be a major issue in church worship? How can you reconcile equality and Paul’s celebration of manhood/womanhood with biblical distinctions in the family and the church?

Do you find it challenging to engage lost culture with conversations about sexuality, gender roles, and how these relate to family and church? Is it helpful to understand them from the teaching on equality and mutual grace offered to men and women?
