1st Corinthians 4:1-5

We've elevated the pastoral role into a space that it wasn't designed to be in. Does your pastor practice servant leadership? Paul addresses this in our text.

What do you believe is the role of the pastor in your life? By what standard do you evaluate his job?

Are there characteristics of modern-day pastors that have bothered you? What characteristics are they?

When you read Paul say that "it is a very small thing to be judged by you", what is your immediate response? Do you believe the church has authority over the pastor or does that authority solely rest on Christ?

Our bylaws say that elder discipline falls under the jurisdiction of the elder board. Do you think that is valuable? Why or why not?

Is it good news that we aren't even to evaluate ourselves outside of being evaluated by Christ? Do you understand how your pastor's calling is the calling of God and not the calling of himself?

How has your evaluation process been changed after hearing a teaching like this? What is most challenging or most rewarding from today's message?
