## Seeing Jesus: Sacrificial Lamb

Man's sin requires an atonement, and the Father instituted a sacrificial system that brought forgiveness when offered.

Christ came to become the ultimate atonement as our great Sacrificial Lamb.

Consider the required sacrificial practices in the Old Covenant. How do they seem to be a burden for those giving them?

Why does it seem justified for God to require a sacrifice as a penalty? How does the New Covenant justice system differ from the societal justice system that we exist under?

Consider the Passover and all of the details (penalty for sin, first born son, blood of a lamb to cover the door, wrath of God). What are the natural parallels found in Christ?

The law of the Spirit has set us free in Christ from the law of sin and death. Christ came in the likeness of flesh to do what those weakened by the flesh could not do. (Romans 8)

Consider the substitutionary atonement. How is redemptive history changed by this? Do you see how all of eternity hinges on the GIFT of an eternal sacrifice?

The Old Covenant asked for man to offer a sacrifice to God, the New Covenant includes God offering a sacrifice for man. Do you understand how we live under the better covenant?
