1. Peace often shows up in unexpected places.

Luke 2:8 (NLT)

⁸That night there were shepherds staying in the fields nearby, guarding their flocks of sheep.

Peace meets you right where you are.

Isaiah 26:3 (NLT)

³You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you, all whose thoughts are fixed on you!

Peace isn't found in a place – it's found in a Person.

2. Peace is announced with praise.

Luke 2:9-10 (NLT)

⁹Suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared among them, and the radiance of the Lord's glory surrounded them. They were terrified, ¹⁰but the angel reassured them. "Don't be afraid!" he said. "I bring you good news that will bring great joy to all people."

Luke 2:10b-11 (NLT)

¹⁰... "I bring you good news that will bring great joy to all people. ¹¹The Savior—yes, the Messiah, the Lord—has been born today in Bethlehem, the city of David!"

Ephesians 2:14a (ESV)

¹⁴For He himself is our peace,

Colossians 3:15a (NLT)

¹⁵And let the peace that comes from Christ rule in your hearts.

Peace isn't something Jesus brings separate from Himself. He is our peace.

Heaven doesn't whisper when peace arrives – heaven sings.

3. Peace is promised to those who trust Him.

Luke 2:14 (NLT)

¹⁴ “Glory to God in highest heaven, and peace on earth to those with whom God is pleased.”

John 14:27 (NLT)

²⁷ “I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give is a gift the world cannot give. So don’t be troubled or afraid.”

Philippians 4:6-7 (ESV)

⁶ do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

God’s peace doesn’t depend on circumstances – it depends on surrender.

Jesus doesn’t bring peace to the world – **He is our peace.**
