The people of God should be invested in and treat the community of God as a priority.

People will always find time for what they truly believe is important.

5 PRACTICAL REASONS TO BE AT CHURCH

- 1. Being at Church keeps us all on the same page and builds a sense of connection and unity.
- 2. Being at Church keeps us encouraged to and gives us opportunities to BE the Church.

- 3. Being at Church and being a member is a <u>response</u> to the low-commitment spirit sweeping our <u>culture</u>.
- 4. We should care about the <u>experience</u> of <u>others</u> when they come to church.
- 5. Being at Church, among other spiritual disciplines, does help us <u>grow</u> in our <u>relationship</u> with Jesus and one another.

When we make coming together weekly our priority - It is a reflection of three things:

- Our prioritization of and <u>supremacy</u> of Christ in our lives
- Our understanding of our <u>role</u> in building and maintaining healthy Christian Community
- Demonstration of our <u>humility</u> and willingness to serve <u>others</u> and put them first
