- 2. What does the word 'repent' mean to you? If you are caught up in sin, what steps do you need to take right now, in order to run the other direction?
- 3. Are confession and repentance part of your daily prayer life, why or why not? What is at risk, when we allow sin to remain unaddressed in our lives?

## FOR THE FAMILY...challenging questions for family life:

- 1. The topic of sin may seem like a heavy topic to talk about with kids. Yet, what is interesting is that kids seem to know intuitively the difference between bad and good. Take some time to teach the importance of both 'saying you are sorry to God' and 'repenting' not repeating the bad behavior, action, or attitude.
- 2. How can you describe forgiveness and grace to your family? Better still, how can you display it this week?
- 3. Take some time to pray together as a family.

<b>1 Corinthians 15:22</b> (NLT) <sup>22</sup> Just as everyone dies because we all belong to Adam, everyone who belongs to Christ will be given new life.				
Romans 5:12-21 (excerpt) <sup>18</sup> Yes, Adam's one sin brings condemnation for everyone, but Christ's one act of righteousness brings a right relationship with God and new life for everyone. <sup>19</sup> Because one person disobeyed God, many became sinners. But because one other person obeyed God, many will be made righteous.
