- 4. Take some time to pray for those who you might think of as 'unredeemable'. Perhaps take a step of faith and invite them to church.

### FOR THE FAMILY...challenging questions for family life:

- 1. Read the book of Jonah together as a family. See what questions and discussion emerge with your children.
- 2. Read together Matthew 12:38-41. Explain how Jesus is like Jonah and see what questions your kids might have. Emphasize how much God cares for and loves us.
- 3. Take some time to pray together as a family.

**Matthew 12:38-39** (NLT) <sup>38</sup> One day some teachers of religious law and Pharisees came to Jesus and said, "Teacher, we want you to show us a miraculous sign to prove your authority." <sup>39</sup> But Jesus replied, "Only an evil, adulterous generation would demand a miraculous sign; but the only sign I will give them is the sign of the prophet Jonah.

Jonah 2:8 (NLT) <sup>®</sup>Those who worship false gods turn their backs on all God's mercies.

### HOW WE CAN BE LIKE JONAH

The truth is we are all quick to turn to \_\_\_\_\_.

Jonah 1:1-16

Mark 4:35-41 (NLT) <sup>35</sup> As evening came, Jesus said to his disciples, "Let's cross

to the other side of the lake." <sup>36</sup> So they took Jesus in the boat and started out, leaving the crowds behind (although other boats followed). <sup>37</sup> But soon a fierce storm came up. High waves were breaking into the boat, and it began to fill with water. <sup>38</sup> Jesus was sleeping at the back of the boat with his head on a cushion. The disciples woke him up, shouting, "Teacher, don't you care that we're going to drown?" <sup>39</sup> When Jesus woke up, he rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Silence! Be still!" Suddenly the wind stopped, and there was a great calm. <sup>40</sup> Then he asked them, "Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?" <sup>41</sup> The disciples were absolutely terrified. "Who is this man?" they asked each other. "Even the wind and waves obey him!"

### SIMILARIES BETWEEN JONAH AND JESUS

- Both Jesus and Jonah were in a boat, and both boats were overtaken by a storm the descriptions of the storm are almost identical.
- Both Jesus and Jonah were asleep.
- In both stories, the sailors woke up the sleeper and said, "We're going to die."
- Moreover, in both cases, there was a miraculous divine intervention and the sea was calmed.
- Further, in both stories the sailors then become even more terrified than they were before the storm calmed.
