1. Joy is a Holy Spirit response.

Luke 1:39-45 (NLT) Mary Visits Elizabeth

³⁹ A few days later Mary hurried to the hill country of Judea, to the town ⁴⁰ where Zechariah lived. She entered the house and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ At the sound of Mary's greeting, Elizabeth's child leaped within her, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. ⁴² Elizabeth gave a glad cry and exclaimed to Mary, "God has blessed you above all women, and your child is blessed. ⁴³ Why am I so honored, that the mother of my Lord should visit me? ⁴⁴ When I heard your greeting, the baby in my womb jumped for joy. ⁴⁵ You are blessed because you believed that the Lord would do what he said."

Luke 1:46-56 (NLT) The Magnificat: Mary's Song of Praise

- ⁴⁶ Mary responded, "Oh, how my soul praises the Lord.
- ⁴⁷ How my spirit rejoices in God my Savior!
- ⁴⁸ For he took notice of his lowly servant girl, and from now on all generations will call me blessed.
- ⁴⁹ For the Mighty One is holy, and he has done great things for me.
- ⁵⁰ He shows mercy from generation to generation to all who fear him.
- ⁵¹ His mighty arm has done tremendous things! He has scattered the proud and haughty ones.
- ⁵²He has brought down princes from their thrones and exalted the humble.
- ⁵³ He has filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away with empty hands.
- ⁵⁴ He has helped his servant Israel and remembered to be merciful.
- ⁵⁵ For he made this promise to our ancestors, to Abraham and his children forever."
- ⁵⁶ Mary stayed with Elizabeth about three months and then went back to her own home.

2. Joy overflows into praise.

Philippians 4:4 (NLT)

4 "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!"

Real joy doesn't stay quiet — it is a declaration!

3. Joy trusts God's <u>promise</u>, even before it's fulfilled.

2 Corinthians 4:13,18 (NIV)

13 "It is written: 'I believed; therefore I have spoken." Since we have some of that spirit of faith, we also believe and therefore speak

18 So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal."

Joy isn't based on what we see — it's based on what God has promised.
