- 4. Take some time to thoughtfully pray over today's message.

FOR THE FAMILY...challenging questions for family life:

- 1. From the scriptures provided today, show your children in the Bible where and how Jesus prayed. What questions come up?
- 2. What personal stories about your own prayer experience can you share to encourage and build-up your child's idea of prayer?
- 3. If you do not regularly, determine a time you can pray for your kids every day. Perhaps at bedtime and/or before the school day.
- 4. Take some time pray together.
