# Genesis 34-36

1. Moral Collapse & Leadership Silence
2. Violence done “in God’s name.”
3. Family fractured by favoritism
4. Closing of Chapters/Restoration of Jacob
5. Comparisons of Esau & Jacobs families.  
Worldly success vs humble repentance/  
obedience

# v.1 – God Speaks

1. God initiates
2. “Arise... go up to Bethel”
3. Return, not restart

Rev. 2:4–5 — Return to your first love

Eph. 5:14 — “Arise from the dead”

## v.2-4 — idolatry

1. Put away foreign gods
2. Purify yourselves
3. Change your garments
4. God speaks, Jacob finally leads- the real issue: **idolatry**. Revival doesn't begin with emotion; it begins with repentance and removal.

## v.6-7 – City at the Gate

1. Bethel was the place of vision and vow (Gen 28). Now it becomes the place of obedience and worship.
2. El-Bethel — not just “House of God,” but “God of the House.”

## v.8 – Revival Doesn’t Cancel Grief

Three “burials” – not only people, but  
the old life...?

God is restoring Jacob,  
but He’s also closing chapters.



## v.1 - Strangers but Blessed

The family of Abraham is waiting on the promises of God for a homeland.

(Gen 12:1, 15:18, 17:8, 28:4, 35:12)

While they waited: God guided, provided, and protected.

## v.2-4 - Joseph - A Special Boy!

- Firstborn son of Rachel, but the 11th in birth order.
- Loved by his father and given preferential treatment.
- Tunic symbolized “management material.” Not manual labor.

## v.5-8 Very Unpopular Dream pt 1

- Dreams were taken seriously in ancient Eastern societies; they carried weight.
- Joseph lacked awareness of whom he told and how his brothers felt about him.
- The dream fueled bitterness that was already present in Joseph's brothers.

## v.9-11 Very Unpopular Dream pt 2

- Joseph lacked awareness again, and told his brothers and his father his dream.
- The 2nd dream continued to fuel bitterness that was rapidly growing out of control in Joseph's brothers' hearts.

## v.12-17 From Hebron to Shechem & Beyond

- God is the silent Actor in the text. He is orchestrating His will in the background.
- God is with Joseph from Hebron to Shechem and beyond. In the pit, He is there. In the prison, He is there. God is at work!

# v.18-36 Hatred & God's Protection

**Sin leads to:**

Guilt, shame, regret, lies, brokenness, loss, lasting consequences.

**-God's Working Leads to:**

Life, saving, redemption, restoration, wholeness, reconciliation, freedom.
