1st Corinthians 9:19-23 NKJV –

19 For though I am free from all men, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win the more;

20 and to the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might win Jews; to those who are under the law, as under the law, that I might win those who are under the law;

1st Corinthians 9:19-23 NKJV –

21 to those who are without law, as without law (not being without law toward God, but under law toward Christ), that I might win those who are without law;

22 to the weak I became as weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all men, that I might by all means save some.

23 Now this I do for the gospel's sake, that I may be partaker of it with you.

1 Corinthians 9:19 For though I am free from all men, I have made myself a slave to everyone, so that I may win more [for Christ]. AMP

Pointed Paradox: Free from all and slave to all

Laying down our freedoms in Christ is about loving

Profound Purpose: Maewyn Succat

1 Corinthians 9:20-21 **20** To the Jews I became as a Jew, so that I might win Jews [for Christ]; to men under the Law, [I became] as one under the Law, though not being under the Law myself, so that I might win those who are under the Law. **21** To those who are without (outside) the Law, [I became] as one without the Law, though [I am] not without the law of God, but under the law of Christ, so that I might win those who are without law. AMP

1 Corinthians 9:20-21

1. Participated in Jewish purification ceremonies (**Acts 21:23-26**), had Timothy circumcise (**Acts 16:3**)
2. Did not participate in Jewish law with Gentiles (**Gal 2:11-14; Col 2:11,16**).
3. Born a Jew (**Phil 3:5**), but a new creation (**2 Cor 5:17**) no longer Jew or Greek
4. Christ is the end of the law (**Rom 10:4, Eph 2:15**)

1 Corinthians 9:20-21

5. The believer is not under the law but under grace (**Rom 6:14**).

6. Championed Christian liberty (**Gal 2:4; 5:13**).

7. Had a great burden for his own people (**Rom. 9:1–3; 10:1**)

8. Appointed an apostle primarily to the Gentiles (**Eph. 3:8, Gal 2:7-9**),

9. Preached to both Jews and Greeks (**Acts 20:21**)

1 Corinthians 9:20-21

He did not parade his liberty before the Jews,
Nor did he impose the Law on the Gentiles.

“Freedom is not license to do what I want, but liberation to do what I ought.” (Green)

1 Corinthians 9:22 To the weak I became [as the] weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all men, so that I may by all means [in any and every way] save some [by leading them to faith in Jesus Christ]. AMP

Same Gospel, same message (**1 Cor1:22-23**)

The gain of even “some” is worth the expenditure of “all means.” - Jamieson, R., Fausset

1 Corinthians 9:23 And I do all this for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings along with you. AMP
