1st Corinthians 11:1-16

Coverings, Clippers, and Controversies

- 1 Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ.
- 2 Now I praise you, brethren, that you remember me in all things and keep the traditions just as I delivered them to you.
- 3 But I want you to know that the head of every man is Christ, the head of woman is man, and the head of Christ is God.

4 Every man praying or prophesying, having his head covered, dishonors his head.

5 But every woman who prays or prophesies with her head uncovered dishonors her head, for that is one and the same as if her head were shaved.

6 For if a woman is not covered, let her also be shorn. But if it is shameful for a woman to be shorn or shaved, let her be covered.

- 7 For a man indeed ought not to cover his head, since he is the image and glory of God; but woman is the glory of man.
- 8 For man is not from woman, but woman from man.
- 9 Nor was man created for the woman, but woman for the man.

- 1 Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ.
- 2 Now I praise you, brethren, that you remember me in all things and keep the traditions just as I delivered them to you.
- 3 But I want you to know that the head of every man is Christ, the head of woman is man, and the head of Christ is God.

- 10 For this reason the woman ought to have a symbol of authority on her head, because of the angels.
- 11 Nevertheless, neither is man independent of woman, nor woman independent of man, in the Lord.
- 12 For as woman came from man, even so man also comes through woman; but all things are from God.

- 13 Judge among yourselves. Is it proper for a woman to pray to God with her head uncovered?
- 14 Does not even nature itself teach you that if a man has long hair, it is a dishonor to him?
- 15 But if a woman has long hair, it is a glory to her; for her hair is given to her for a covering.
- 16 But if anyone seems to be contentious, we have no such custom, nor do the churches of God.

Imitate me, just as I imitate Christ. I praise and appreciate you because you remember me in everything and you firmly hold to the [a]traditions [the substance of my instructions], just as I have passed them on to you - AMP

Authority and Submission

Have a Humbley Submitted heart

Disciples are learners under authority

1 Timothy 4:12

Three Fundamentals of Order

Redemption (v. 3–7)

Creation (v. 8–12)

Nature (v. 13–16)

3 But I want you to understand that Christ is the head (authority over) of every man, and man is the head of woman, and God is the head of Christ. 4 Every man who prays or prophesies with something on his head dishonors his head [and the One who is his head]. - AMP

5 And every woman who prays or prophesies when she has her head uncovered disgraces her head; for she is one and the same as the woman whose head is shaved [in disgrace]

Jesus was totally under the authority of God the Father (John 5:19 and 8:28), yet He is equally God (John 1:1, 8:58, 10:30, Philippians 2).

Our Witness to the Community

Covering and Hair

- In Jewish law, it was the mark of adultery (Numbers 5:11-31).
- In the Greek world, it could be the mark of a prostitute or lesbian.

Vs 6-11

Creation -

God established an order of headship, both in the church (1 Corinthians 11 and 1 Timothy 2) and the home (Genesis 1-3, Ephesians 5:23, 1st Peter 3).

Vs 6-11

Angels?! -

Cover their faces in worship (Isa. 6:2)

God has eternal things to teach the universe through us (Ephesians 3:10-11, 1 Corinthians 4:9, and 1 Peter 1:12)

Commans 4.3, and I reter I.IZ
