

Vision: To live out a gospel centered,



# Why is missions in Japan challenging?

- 1. To be Japanese is to be a cultural Buddhist and Shintoist
- 2. Conformity (social harmony), Bushido (code of samurai) honor and shame culture
- 3. Honne (inner self) vs tattemae (public self)
- 4. Christianity is a Western religion (which Christian are you?)

## The Fellowship of the Believers - Acts 2:42-47

42 And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. 43 And awe[a]came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. 44 And all who believed were together and had all things in common. 45 And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need.46 And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts,47 praising God and having favor with all the people. 
