Double Trouble, Twin Problems! Genesis 27:1-46

v.6-11 FEAR -> FAILURE

Isaac repeats Abraham's lie; fear of man (Prov. 29:25)

Pagan king rebukes the patriarch; God protects the line.

God protects even when we fear, fail, and compromise.

v.1-11 Legacy of Faith

Abraham leaves Isaac the altar and tent (26:24-25) the spiritual and material Grace at the Grave - God's promises outlast His people (Heb. 11:13–16; Rom. 4:20-22) "The righteous shall live by faith" (Rom. 1:17) "Well done, good and faithful servant" (Matt. 25:21)

Pressure -> Presence -> Provision

- 1. Famine Where is your famine? God means to meet you there.
- 2. Fear What fear scripts your choices? Presence is the antidote.
- 3. Failure Grace is stronger than generational patterns.

Chapter 27 Familial BLISS!

Isaac - Committed to his own will above God's, in his plan to bless Esau.

Rebekah - Committed to God's will, but accomplishing it through her own means.

Jacob - Willing participant in deception for personal gain.

Esau - Ruled by his flesh rather than God.

God's Will Be Done

Proverbs 16:9

"The heart of man plans his way, but the LORD establishes his steps."

Proverbs 19:21

"Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the LORD that will stand."

Proverbs 21:30

"No wisdom, no understanding, no counsel can avail against the LORD."

v.1-4 A Father's Plan

- -Isaac, aging, plans to bless Esau as the head of the family.
- -He wants to relish in his son's giftedness, forget what he lacks, and pursue his own will.
- -His plan is simple: eat and bless. (Very man like)

v.1-4 A Father's Plan Rose-colored Glasses:

- -Dismisses sin, character shortages, and warnings.
- -Only see things/people through the lens we want to, rather than the reality.
- -Leads to ruin for them and us.

v.5-17 A Mother's Plan

- -Rebekah overhears Isaac's plan and hatches a plan in response. Trick dad into blessing Jacob instead.
- -Use very complicated means to trick him; the ends justify the means.
- -Is willing to do the work necessary to pull off the deception.

v.5-17 A Mother's Plan

Utilitarianism:

The doctrine that actions are right if they are useful or for the benefit of a majority. "The greater good."

Uses man's wisdom while bypassing God's standards of righteousness.

v.5-24 A Son's Plan - Jacob

- -Fear of being caught and cursed, rather than a fear of doing wrong.
- -Willing to go along with Mother's plan if she takes the risk of a curse.
- -Follows through with deceiving his Father, is willing to throw God into the lie.

v.30-41 A Brother's Plan - Esau

- -Obeyed his Father and sought his blessing
- -Did not get it, although he did what was asked.
- -To right the wrong, he plans to murder his brother.
- -He loses the relationship with his brother.

Genesis-Revelation God's Plan

- -to bring a Perfect Savior through an imperfect people.
- -to bring His will to pass despite the evil will of the people.
- -to save all those who will repent and believe in His name. Through the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
