1 Corinthians 15:33-34

{33} Do not be deceived: "Bad company corrupts good morals/character/habbits."

{34} Wake up/sobber up, as you ought, and stop sinning; for some have no knowledge of God. I speak this to your shame.

Do not be deceived = There is a problem

Deceived = πλανᾶω planáō (G4106); to cause to roam from safety, truth, or virtue: —to go astray, deceive, err, seduce, wander, be out of the way.

Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, accurately handling the word of truth. - 2 Timothy 2:15 NASB95

{14} Do not be bound together with unbelievers; for what partnership have righteousness and lawlessness, or what fellowship has light with darkness?

{15} Or what harmony has Christ with Belial, or what has a believer in common with an unbeliever?

v 33 Bad Company

Bad / evil = κακός (G2556), worthless, depraved, or injurious:—bad, evil, harm, ill, noisome, wicked.

He who walks with wise men will be wise,
But the companion of fools will suffer
harm. - Proverbs 13:20 NASB95

v 34 Sober up, show up, and look up.
