

Church =

ἐκκλησία (ekklēsia) =

“Called Out Ones”

- a gathering of people called out from their homes into some public place, an assembly. (See Mat 16:18, 1st Cor 1:2, etc.)

Church =

ἐπισυναγωγή (episynagōgē) =

“Assembly”

- a Christian meeting (for worship), a gathering together in one place, to come to the side of. (Heb 10:25)

Purpose of the Church Gathering

1. Eph. 4:11–16 – Church exists to equip the saints and build up the body into maturity in Christ
2. Col. 1:28–29 – Proclaim Christ to present believers mature

3. Heb. 5:12-14 – Move from milk to solid food; grow beyond spiritual infancy

4. Heb. 6:1 – “Go on to maturity” rather than remaining immature

5. Acts 13:2 – Gathered church ministers to the Lord in worship and obedience

6. 1 Pet. 2:5 – We are a holy priesthood offering spiritual sacrifices to God

7. Matt. 28:19–20 – The church's mission is to make disciples, not spectators

The church embodies the realized activity of salvation and good works (2 Tim. 3:15), the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things (Eph. 3:9-10), and a tangible expression of gospel love and living (Col. 1:24).

Reflection Questions

“For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”
-Matthew 6:21NKJV

We are treasure hunters, meaning makers and value finders by nature. Much of what we treasure can be detected by asking good questions and paying attention to how we feel about the things, people, situations and goals we treasure most. For the Christian, we are called to treasure our Lord Jesus Christ and His kingdom and our new heart wants this. However, our old man, the flesh is still at work and we should use God's word and questions to root out who is in control. Is it the new heart or the old man? Answer the below questions honestly, not as a Bible study, but as a true reflection of what is in your heart.

1. What do you love? Is there something you love more than God or your neighbor?
2. What do you seek? What are your personal expectations and goals? What are your intentions? What are you working for?
3. Where do you bank your hopes? What hope are you working toward or building your life around?
4. What do you think you need?
5. What are you really going after in the situations and relationships of life? What are you really working to get?
6. Where do you find refuge, safety, comfort, and escape? When are you fearful, discouraged, and upset, where do you run? Do you run to God for comfort and safety or something else?

7. What do you trust? Do you functionally rest in the Lord? Do you find your sense of well-being in His presence and promises or do you rest in something else or someone else?
8. How do you define success or failure in any particular situation? Are your standards God's standards?
9. What do you see as your rights? What do you feel entitled to?
10. What do you really want out of life? What payoff are you seeking from the things you do? What is the return you are looking for?

After honestly answering these questions, find the scriptural answer for them. What does the Bible say about these things and our desires? What do we love versus what the Bible tells us to love? What do we seek versus what the Bible calls us to seek? You can follow this method for every single question that is asked. What was my answer versus what the Bible is calling us to do, seek or follow. The areas that are not aligned with the Scriptures are the areas the Lord will work in for His glory and our good. Share this with your spouse, a friend, or an accountability partner to work through a plan for abiding in Christ in 2025 and praying for one another regarding these things.
