Read John 13:1-30

Did anything stand out either from Justin's message or reading through John together?

What is the significance of Jesus washing the disciples' feet, and the timing in which He decided to do it?

At first, Peter doesn't allow Jesus to wash his feet, and then his mindset changes.

Why does Peter's mindset change? What does Peter begin to understand about the character of Jesus?

Jesus used His power and influence to sacrificially serve others. **Do you do the same? What are your spheres of influence and what would it practically look like to sacrificially serve in those spaces?**

Jesus cleanses us and it is a complete cleansing. Justin mentioned that Jesus doesn't only bathe or only wash our feet, but He does both. **What is that a metaphor of? In what ways do you try to "bathe" yourself, or "wash" your own feet as opposed to letting Jesus do both?**

Jesus prepares and it is a glorious mission. **What mission does Jesus have for you to step into?** *(Leader note: Generically the Great Commission, and then each person has a specific role they play in that commission).*

Justin mentioned there are two wrong responses:

- Judas betrays and rejects Christ allowing Satan to have a foothold.
- Peter holds Christ at a distance, showing how it is easier to do things for Christ than to receive grace from Him.

Which of those 2 wrong responses are you more likely to fall into?

Justin also mentioned a right response: To remember grace, renew your joy in grace, and represent the author of grace. **Of those 3 responses, which may God be asking you to respond to John 13 with?**
