Read Romans 16:25-27

## What is something that stood out from Clayton's sermon?

Clayton said it can be easy for us as Christians to "learn the steps" of Christianity but to forget the Father. In what ways can you get caught up in "doing the steps" but forget the Father?

(The irreligious do not think their sin is that bad or needs atonement, the moralist makes self-determined rules to judge others and their own righteousness).
