Icebreaker: What is a movie that you love to watch over and over again and why?

Read Daniel 7:1-22 (and then ask someone to summarize what we just read.) What is one thing that stood out to you from our passage and/or Justin's message?

What was the most interesting thing or something new that you learned from this apocalyptic literature?
