Read Proverbs 5:1-14, Proverbs 6:20-35

What part of the sermon or passage stood out to you the most, and why?

The sermon said, "Sin overpromises and underdelivers." **Where have you experienced that to be true in your own life?**

The father in Proverbs describes sin as beginning in the heart before it shows up in our actions. **Why do you think it's important to address our desires, not just our behaviors?**

Which of these questions do you find most revealing when examining your own heart?

- What lie is this sin telling me?
- What desire is driving it?
- What is it destroying?

The sermon challenged us to identify the lies our sin tells us. **What are some common lies we are tempted to believe today?** *(You could lead using example prompts like: lies about marriage, lies about the purpose of life, lies about what brings happiness and joy, etc.)*

The sermon described all sin as spiritual adultery against God. How does that metaphor deepen your understanding of the seriousness of sin?

The story of Hosea shows God relentlessly pursuing His people despite their unfaithfulness. **When have you experienced God's pursuing grace in your own life despite your unfaithfulness to God?**

The sermon emphasized that freedom from sin comes from having our hearts captured by Christ rather than merely trying harder. **What practices help your heart delight more in Jesus?**

What's one practical step you can take this week to respond to God's grace and fight the particular sin you're facing?
