Read Exodus 20:15 and Matthew 5:13-16

What are things that you do not want to share with others? (Acting as if those things are yours and not God's to share).

Pat mentioned common excuses we can use to justify stealing. They were entitlement, need, addiction, impressing others, and convenience. **Which of those 5 do you most commonly use to justify stealing?**
