Sermon Discussion Questions

John Wesley's General Rules provide a framework for Christian living – a guide to the actions that result when we are following Christ. This is the 3rd of 3 weeks looking at them together. Today we finished with "attending upon all the ordinances of God." To reflect on how this applies for you, review Wesley's list below. Which examples convict you the most? Which need to be adapted? What spiritual disciplines are essential to your relationship with God and others?

- The public worship of God.
- The ministry of the Word, either read or expounded.
- The Supper of the Lord.
- Family and private prayer.
- Searching the Scriptures.
- Fasting or abstinence.

Continue to reflect on the first general rule of "doing good" with these daily Scripture readings:

- Monday: Psalm 105:1-11
- Tuesday: Colossians 2:6-15
- Wednesday: John 21:15-25
- Thursday: Luke 5:12-16

- Saturday: Acts 2:42-47
