

GOD'S REDEMPITIVE TIMELINE

Paul's Sermon at Pisidian Antioch

Acts 13:17–31

As Paul stands in the synagogue at Pisidian Antioch, he walks his hearers down a single road, from the calling of the patriarchs to the empty tomb, to show that Jesus is where Israel's whole story was headed all along. Use the timeline below to follow the pathway of his argument, point by point.

1	The Patriarchs Chosen God chose the fathers of Israel.	Acts 13:17a Genesis 12:1–3
2	The Egyptian Sojourn God prospered the people during their stay in Egypt.	Acts 13:17b Exodus 1:7
3	The Exodus With mighty power, God led Israel out of Egypt.	Acts 13:17c Exodus 12:51
4	The Wilderness Years For about forty years, God bore with Israel's conduct in the wilderness.	Acts 13:18 Numbers 14:33–34
5	The Conquest of Canaan God overthrew seven nations and gave their land to Israel as an inheritance.	Acts 13:19 Deuteronomy 7:1; Joshua 14:1
spanning about 450 years - (Acts 13:20a)		
6	The Era of the Judges God gave Israel judges until the prophet Samuel.	Acts 13:20b Judges 2:16
7	King Saul The people asked for a king, and God gave them Saul son of Kish, who reigned forty years.	Acts 13:21 1 Samuel 10:1
8	King David God removed Saul and raised up David, a man after His own heart, to do all His will.	Acts 13:22 1 Samuel 13:14; 16:12–13
9	Jesus the Promised Savior From David's offspring, God brought to Israel a Savior, Jesus, just as He promised.	Acts 13:23 2 Samuel 7:12–16
10	John's Preparatory Ministry Before Jesus came, John preached a baptism of repentance to all Israel.	Acts 13:24 Isaiah 40:3; Malachi 3:1
11	John's Testimony As John finished his course, he denied being the Christ and pointed to the One coming after him.	Acts 13:25
12	The Message of Salvation Sent This word of salvation was sent to the children of Abraham and to God-fearing Gentiles.	Acts 13:26 Isaiah 49:6
13	Jerusalem's Rejection	Acts 13:27 Isaiah 53:3; Psalm 118:22

The rulers in Jerusalem did not recognize Jesus, yet in condemning Him they fulfilled the words of the prophets.

14 The Unjust Sentence

Though no grounds for death were found, they asked Pilate to have Him executed.

When all that was written of Him was accomplished, He was taken down and laid in a tomb.

4. Where do you see yourself on this timeline, as one who has received “this message of salvation” (v. 26)?
