Sermon Outline - Sun, January 1, 2020 – Vision - In Search of a New Hearth Isaiah 65:17-22; Revelation 21:1-6

New heaven new earth out of box vision of who we ae to lead

<u>Overview of Month</u> – Every January we focus on the topic of Vision. As we enter into a new year with a new time slate, it seems like a good time to really pull out to think big and remind ourselves that God's plan is about transformational outcomes at the big and small level.

Exegesis

- Our scriptures come from Isaiah (most popular book); and Revelations (least popular)
- Revelations = Lots of debate about when this was written; time defines context
- John of Patmos single writer w. some additions possible. Patmos in Greece
- Vision Definition the act of power of imagination
- Revelation definitely fits the bill of being imaginative. Dense imagery that folks are still unpacking working in 7s,7 eyed lamb, etc.
- New Heaven and a New Earth → Hearth the place in a fire where the logs burn away so that the house gets heat but doesn't burn down

Key Points –

- 1. See God with Us
- 2. Feel God Addressing our Needs and Traumas (sometimes with us being the hands and feet of Christ in each other's lives)
- 3. Imagine us living the Kin(g)dom of God on Earth (Note about Kin(g)dom)

Before we start talking about where we are going and what God is calling us to, I am challenging us all to expand our vision. Each Sunday we are going to be invited into deeper imagination about the world God is calling us to live into.

Imagination Exercises -

1. I Dream of a World – Langston Hughes wrote a poem for the world of his dreams – it was revolutionary in his time and continues to be so now. Start writing your own dream! (If you want it to rhyme you can, but you can also just start writing phrases and tie them together more poetically later.)
