

Text: 1 Peter 1:3-9

Big Idea: These verses, in the original Greek, comprise one long sentence with Peter giving praise for our salvation. In them Peter teaches salvation as a living hope of comfort providing perspective on life struggles in the here and now.

- Your living hope is grounded in the <u>resurrection</u> of Jesus
- Living hope is secured and guarded by God
- You are being <u>refined</u> so you can <u>receive</u> your living hope.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Biblical hope is the expectation of a future with certainty through God's renewing of our lives. The world's view is focused much closer in time, perhaps even denying a need for salvation. How should a Christian have a different perspective on life's challenges than the world?
- 2. How is the resurrection relevant to you in the "here and now"?
- 3. How has someone provided encouragement to you in moments of trial?
- 4. What are <u>your</u> challenges in seeking God's glory above your own?
- 5. How have you seen God work, over time, to refine you?
