



Text: Galatians 3:10-26

Big Idea: Paul gives us with a coherent view of the Gospel throughout Scripture. Because God promised Abraham, we can trust in that same promise today.

- Blessings come through the promise not the law.
- The law restrains evil.
- The law shows us we need a promise.

Discussion Questions:

1. When a person makes you a promise, what do you think about and how do you react? How does that impact the way you think about God's promises?
2. Today there are plenty of societal issues where we might take a stance that is inherently "good" and consistent with keeping the law. In what ways can those stances distract us from leading a Gospel-led life? How can we bring the Gospel into our responses?
3. There are "morally good people" who are not disciples of Jesus. What would you expect to happen to someone like that who accepts Christ as Savior? How might that person's behavior or actions look different afterwards?
4. Read James 2:14-24 noting James' use of Abraham as an example to a Jewish audience. Why are actions important? How does the teaching in James complement Paul's instructions in Galatians?
