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THIS SUNDAY IS OFTEN CALLED PALM SUNDAY IN REMEMBRANCE OF JESUS' **TRIUMPHAL ENTRY INTO JERUSALEM THE** WEEK OF HIS CRUCIFIXION. THIS MORNING WE WILL BE UNPACKING EXODUS 12 WHERE THE VERY FIRST PASSOVER LAMBS **ARE SACRIFICED AND WE WILL SEE THAT IN** THIS FIRST PASSOVER OUR LORD AND SAVIOR JESUS CHRIST IS PREFIGURED AS THE COMING AND FINAL PASSOVER LAMB.

	Passover & Preparation Day for the properties of the provident of the prov	6 PM- 6 PM	Wednesday- Thursday	Nisan 14	The Passover always fell on the 14 th of Nisan (Exodus 12:18-19) and it was followed by a High Day or a High Sabbath Day. These days were different from the weekly Sabbath which was observed every Saturday. In the year that Jesus was crucified the High Sabbath Day was on a Friday (John 19:31), thus there were back to back Sabbaths with both Friday and Saturday being Sabbath Days. Every Sabbath Day was also preceded by a day of preparation since there was to be no work on the Sabbath Day. This day was
					set aside for preparing meals in advance and before a High Sabbath day like this one, they would also be getting all the leaven removed from their homes in preparation for the feast of unleavened bread. The leaven was symbolic of sin and every home was to be free from sin observance of the Passover lamb. It is divine that the sin problem was cared for on the preparation Day as Jesus, the Passover lamb, was crucified and became sin for us!

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QUALITIES OF THE LAMB Exodus 12:5

Without blemish Male Year old Sheep or goat



PROCEDURE FOR SACRIFICE Exodus 12:6-11,46

- lamb kept until Nisan 14 then killed at twilight
- Blood spread on two doorposts and lintel with bunches of hyssop (v. 22)
- Eat the flesh at night with entire animal Roasted over fire, not eaten raw or boiled with any remains burned before morning. Entire family and participants to remain in the house until morning (v. 22)
- Eaten with unleavened bread & bitter herbs
- Eat quickly with belt and sandals fastened with staff in hand
- Lamb cannot have a single bone broken (v. 46). This is fulfilled in Jesus' death (John 19:36) and King David's prophesy (Psalm 34:20).



EXPLANATION OF PASSOVER Exodus 12:12-20

- Firstborn (males cf. Ex. 13:12, 22:29, 34:19) in Egypt would be killed both man and animals
- final plague is the culmination of the attacks upon Egypt's gods that were powerless to protect their worshippers
- The blood serves as a sign of those that will be passed over and spared from otherwise certain death
- This became a memorial day (Passover) and 7 day feast (feast of unleavened bread) that was to be kept forever to the Lord
- All leaven, which represents sin, is to be removed from the house
- 1st & 7th days are High days like weekly sabbath days.



FIRST PASSOVER IMPLEMENTED Exodus 12:21-36

Verse 23

when the LORD sees the blood he passes over that house (Prefigures Jesus' death in our place)

Verses 29-30 At midnight the LORD strikes every firstborn of man and livestock in all of Egypt and every home in Egypt is affected by the death of a firstborn

Verses 31-36 Pharaoh finally relents and tells Moses and the people to go and asks Moses to bless him. The Israelites go house to house asking for gold/silver/garments and the Egyptians willingly hand over their valuables and are thereby plundered without force!



DELIVERED FROM EGYPTIAN BONDAGE Exodus 12:37-51

All the people of Israel did just as the LORD commanded Moses and Aaron. And on that very day the LORD brought the people of Israel out of the land of Egypt by their hosts.

Verses 50-51

JESUS CAME AT JUST THE RIGHT TIME

Matthew 21 records Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem on the 10th of Nisan as the Passover lambs were being led into Jerusalem for their selection as Passover lambs. The crowds praised Jesus as the rightful heir to the throne of David because they desired a King to overthrow Rome not realizing that what they needed more then national deliverance from Rome was spiritual deliverance from their bondage to sin leading to eternal death. Jesus came in his first advent as the lamb who would take away the sins of the world.



OFFERING HIMSELF AS THE PERFECT SACRIFICE

A few short days later on Nisan 14 Jesus would willingly allow Himself to be falsely accused of blasphemy and subsequently sentenced to death. He would allow mortal, sinful men to beat Him, mock Him, spit upon Him and blaspheme Him. He would carry His own instrument of death, the cross, upon His shoulders. At calvary Jesus would stretch His hands out upon a cross and willingly give His physical life as our once-for-all Passover lamb. His sinless life in exchange for our sinful and broken one.



FAITH IN HIM

Upon the cross Jesus extends forgiveness of our sins and salvation from certain eternal damnation if we will turn to Him in faith. Much like the Israelites in Egypt the life blood of another is offered in place of our own life blood. John put it this way when Jesus approached him, "Behold the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." Jesus lived the perfect life we were required to live and died the death that we deserved so that we could go free, to the glory of the Father.
