JOB 40:6-41:34 (NIV84) -

40:6-8 - Then the LORD spoke to Job out of the storm: ⁷“Brace yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer me.

⁸“Would you discredit my justice? Would you condemn me to justify yourself?

40:9-14 - Do you have an arm like God’s, and can your voice thunder like his? ¹⁰Then adorn yourself with glory and splendor, and clothe yourself in honor and majesty. ¹¹Unleash the fury of your wrath, look at every proud man and bring him low, ¹²look at every proud man and humble him, crush the wicked where they stand. ¹³Bury them all in the dust together; shroud their faces in the grave. ¹⁴Then I myself will admit to you that your own right hand can save you.

40:15-24 - “Look at the behemoth, which I made along with you and which feeds on grass like an ox. ¹⁶What strength he has in his loins, what power in the muscles of his belly!

¹⁷His tail sways like a cedar; the sinews of his thighs are close-knit.

¹⁸His bones are tubes of bronze, his limbs like rods of iron.

¹⁹He ranks first among the works of God, yet his Maker can approach him with his sword.

²⁰The hills bring him their produce, and all the wild animals play nearby.

²¹Under the lotus plants he lies, hidden among the reeds in the marsh.

²²The lotuses conceal him in their shadow; the poplars by the stream surround him.

²³When the river rages, he is not alarmed; he is secure, though the Jordan should surge against his mouth.

²⁴Can anyone capture him by the eyes, or trap him and pierce his nose?

41:1-11 - “Can you pull in the Leviathan with a fishhook or tie down his tongue with a rope?

²Can you put a cord through his nose or pierce his jaw with a hook? ³Will he keep begging you for mercy? Will he speak to you with gentle words? ⁴Will he make an agreement with you for you to take him as your slave for life? ⁵Can you make a pet of him like a bird or put him on a leash for your girls? ⁶Will traders barter for him? Will they divide him up among the merchants? ⁷Can you fill his hide with harpoons or his head with fishing spears? ⁸If you lay a hand on him, you will remember the struggle and never do it again! ⁹Any hope of subduing him is false; the mere sight of him is overpowering. ¹⁰No one is fierce enough to rouse him. Who then is able to stand against me? ¹¹Who has a claim against me that I must pay? Everything under heaven belongs to me.

41:33-34 - Nothing on earth is his equal—a creature without fear.

³⁴He looks down on all that are haughty; he is king over all that are proud.”

REVELATION 12:9 - The great dragon was hurled down—that ancient serpent called the devil, or Satan, who leads the whole world astray. He was hurled to the earth, and his angels with him.

REVELATION 20:2 - He seized the dragon, that ancient serpent, who is the devil, or Satan, and bound him for a thousand years.
