1

- I) V8-11 INTRO: For we do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, of our trouble which REVIEW
- II) Paul had just told the Corinthians that God comforts us in all our tribulation (V4-5) In V5 he referred to this as the sufferings of Christ

 LET ME DEVELOP THIS
- III) What does he mean when he speaks of the sufferings of Christ
 He is speaking of the troubles Jesus endured on earth
- IV) While on earth He was mocked, beaten, scourged, rejected, and ultimately crucified **Spiritually**, He endured agony in the garden of Gethsemane
- V) This was part of how He suffered on our behalf so we could be forgiven
 His sufferings were endured on our behalf, so we could be reconciled to Go
 Ro 5:10 For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the
 death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life
 PAUL IS SAYING THAT JESUS SUFFERED
- VI) What makes us think that we won't?

 Troubles are part of the Christian life, and we can, and we often do, suffer This is something that we are prepared to do, and should not be taken by surprise
- VII) Troubles are part of the way that we learn the deeper things of walking with Jesus It is through afflictions that the draw of the world in our lives is broken It is how we learn to reject the things that distract us
- VIII) It is through difficulties that our vision of heaven becomes more clear
 Afflictions purify our faith and help us to center on eternal matters
 Ro 8:18 I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us
- IX) The various troubles that we endure serve to prepare us for eternity

 They drive us to our knees and purify our faith and our priorities in life
- X) In the end, we embrace whatever we experience knowing the result is good
 We end up knowing God in a deeper and more personal way
 1 Pe 2:21 To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an
 example, that you should follow in His steps

SATAN OPPOSES THIS

- I) This means, to follow Jesus is to become a target of the devil
 We come under fire, opposition, spiritual resistance, and attack
 1 Pe 5:8-9 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world.
- II) This should not surprise us, as *there is a purpose* in the afflictions we experience Ro 5:3-5 Not only so, but we also glory in our *sufferings* (afflictions), because we know that suffering produces *perseverance* (patient waiting), perseverance, *character*; and character *hope*. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.
- III) Knowing that God is working in us as we endure afflictions strengthens us
 We are prepared to endure struggles, and look in faith to the results
 1 Pe. 4:12-13 Beloved do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to
 try you, as though some strange thing happened to you; but rejoice to the extent that
 you partake of Christ's sufferings, that when His glory is revealed, you may also be glad
 with exceeding joy.

PART OF THE RESULTS

- IV) V6 Now if we are afflicted it is for your consolation and salvation You are equipped to be a comforter to others who too will go through hard times
- V) Paul's endurance was a testimony to them: Hang in there
 Josh 1:9 Have I not commanded you to be strong and courageous? Do not be
 afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go.

 FINALLY
- VI) V7 And our hope for you is steadfast because we know that as you are partakers of The depth of consolation we receive balances the depth of suffering we endure Ro 8:16-17 The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God: And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with Him, that we may be also glorified together.
- VII) Our patient endurance in our tribulation when observed, encourages others It also teaches them to encourage others, also

Jas 5:11 Behold, we count those blessed who endured. You have heard of the endurance of Job and have seen the outcome of the Lord's dealings, that the Lord is full of compassion and is merciful.

- I) Paul continues addressing some of the charges being lodged against him
- II) Infiltrators had entered in, spreading lies to undermine him and his message
 They knew if they undermined his credibility, they could discredit his message
- III) Because the message is salvation, Paul felt it necessary to answer his critics
 He doesn't want to do this, but in this case, it is necessary
 Pr 26:5 Be sure to answer the foolish arguments of fools, or they will become wise in their own estimation.
- IV) Under ordinary circumstances, it is normally best to not respond if not necessary In this case, it is necessary because the message is being changed
- V) As we will later see, they are preaching a different Jesus and message 2 Co 11:4 For you gladly tolerate anyone who comes to you and preaches a different Jesus, not the one we preached; and you accept a Spirit and a gospel completely different from the Spirit and the gospel you received from us!

BEGIN STUDY

- VI) V8 We do not want you to be *ignorant* brethren of *our trouble* which came to us in This trouble is unnamed: it may be a riot that occurred in Ephesus (Ac 19:23-41) This uproar was over Paul's impact on idolatry, especially worship of Diana
- VII) V8 This trouble took its toll: We were burdened beyond measure, above strength Paul was under incredible stress, weighed down above human strength
- VIII) Paul's message was setting people free from idolatry, and it effected the culture People were leaving idolatry, and it effected the livelihood of idol makers
- IX) This prompted an idol maker named Demetrius to rally against Paul
 He said the gospel turned people from idolatru, and destroyed their livelihood
 The result was an uproar and the whole city was in chaos and confusion
- X) A mob seized two of Paul's traveling companions (Gaius and Aristarchus)

 The mob rushed into the theater, and began shouting for two hours

 Paul had to be restrained from coming to their defense, and departed

 THE EFFECT
- XI) V8 We despaired: We had no escape and at a total loss; without resources

- I) The Corinthians were unaware of the toll it took on him, so Paul informs them of it They knew he went through difficulties, but did not understand the personal cost POINT
- II) Though you are aware of my affliction, you are ignorant of the cost I have paid
 This is normal: how could somebody know all the details of somebody else's life
 Spiritual apathy, unawareness or immaturity can blind us to the cost that is paid
 PAUL SAYS
- III) V8 We were burdened, and we were despairing for life itself
 In the face of this, I have remained faithful to Jesus and in my love for you
- IV) V9 Yes, we had the sentence of death in ourselves that we should not trust in Sentence: A Judicial sentence, an official verdict with no hope of a reprieve
- V) We had no human hope: We were without strength to save ourselves
 How vulnerable! It was at this point that God stepped in, and delivered him
 Ps 116:8-9 For you, O LORD, have delivered my soul from death, my eyes from
 tears, my feet from stumbling, that I may walk before the LORD in the land of the living.

 WHAT DID HE GAIN
- VI) V9 That we should not trust in ourselves but God who raises the dead Thought: God raises the dead, and was able to rescue Paul from death's grip LESSON
- VII) What did God remind him of, and what does he want them to learn?

 Do not trust in your own abilities to deliver yourself, but in His
- VIII) This is the heart of the Christian faith: Trusting in the Lord with all of our hearts Jn 15:5 I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing.

 Phil 4:13
- IX) V10 Who delivered us from so great a death and does deliver us in whom we trust Who delivered, does deliver, and will deliver: Past, present, future
- X) God has been faithful, is now faithful, and will continue to be faithful in the future Ps. 34:4 I sought the LORD, and He answered me; He delivered me from all my fears.
- 2 Pe 2:9 the Lord knows how to rescue godly men from trials and to hold the unrighteous for the Day of Judgment, while continuing their punishment.

- I) V10 God delivered us from so great a death

 The death He delivered us from was one that was terrible to experience
 Just the thought of this kind of death was terrible
- II) V10 God does deliver us

 He continues delivering us from any present danger
- III) V10 in whom we trust that He will still deliver us
 Though we are in constant peril, I know He will continue to deliver us
 This gives me the confidence to continue proclaiming His message
- IV) V11 You also helping together in prayer for us that thanks may be given by many God will continue delivering them because of their continuing prayer
- V) What he has endured may turn to blessings because of their prayer for him He is comforted and encouraged by their prayers, and is encouraging more
- VI) Paul knew that God would continue to deliver him 2 Ti 4:18 The Lord will deliver me from every evil work and preserve me for His heavenly kingdom. To Him be glory forever and ever. Amen!
- VII) Paul knew that spiritual work was accomplished by prayer
 Because this is true, he needed them to keep him in prayer
 Eph. 6:19-20 Pray also for me, that whenever I open my mouth, words may be
 given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am
 an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should.
- VIII) V11 that thanks may be given by many persons on our behalf for the gift granted to By requesting continued prayer, he was also reinforcing their loving relationship
- X) In telling them he had suffered much he is also provoking their affection for him He is not asking for pity, but is reminding them of his selflessness
- XI) By telling them of his situation, he is informing them of the cost he has paid He has put his life on the line for the gospel, and this should validate his ministry
- XII) They should not listen to the gossip of the false teachers who are attacking him

- I) The gift granted him was deliverance from danger as well as the suffering
- II) This brings us to **two more** of the charges that were lodged against him In our first study I mentioned there were around 25 charges he answers
- III) We already saw the 1st charge: any suffering he endured was well deserved (V3) Job 4:8 As I have observed, those who plow evil and those who sow trouble reap it
- IV) In the next verses, Paul responds to two more charges

 2nd charge: V12 He is selfish and carnal

 3rd charge: V13 He exaggerates his accomplishments, and is not plain speaking
- V) V12 This brings us to the place of addressing the **2**nd charge lodged against him He was selfish, carnal and uses fleshly wisdom
- VI) These things they are saying are designed to steal the hearts of the people

 This was because if they had their hearts, they could take advantage of them

 2 Co 11:20 For you put up with it if one brings you into bondage, if one devours

 (financially exploits) you, if one takes from you, if one exalts himself, if one strikes you on the face.

HE ANSWERS THE CHARGE

- VII) V12 Our boasting is this, the testimony of our conscience that we conducted Boasting: Exultation, proud confidence, reason for boasting
- VIII) Paul had examined his own motives and trusted that they were pure Job 23:11 My foot has held fast to His steps; I have kept His way and not turned aside.
- IX) The false teachers were claiming he used fleshly methods to entrap them His message was filled with false promises of an easy salvation Instead, he is saying his message is filled with the grace of God
- X) Though he was being judged by them, he knew that the ultimate judge is God 1 Co 4:3-4 But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by a human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself. For I know nothing against myself, yet I am not justified by this; but He who judges me is the Lord.
- XI) Notice how he says our boasting is the testimony of our conscience

- I) Conscience: Distinguishes between what is morally good and morally bad He could boast in many things, but instead boasted of his clean conscience
- II) For Paul, keeping his conscience clean was of utmost importance
 Ac 24:16 I strive always to keep my conscience clear before God and man.

 APPLICATION
- III) Part of the blessing of a clean conscience is it makes confident teaching possible Hypocrisy undermines the power of the preacher as well as the message itself
- IV) This is one reason why he made it clear that teachers were to have good character They were to be without reproach and a good reputation amongst non-Christians 1 Ti 3:7 Moreover he must have a good testimony among those who are outside, lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil
- V) V12 He demonstrated this by living in simplicity and godly sincerity
 Simplicity: Without selfishness, pretense, or hypocrisy
 1 Co 2:4-5 My message and my preaching were not with persuasive words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith would not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power
- VI) Godly sincerity: Speaks of perfect openness, with purity of motive

 1 Th 2:3-6 For our exhortation did not come from error or uncleanness, nor was it
 in deceit. But as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, even
 so we speak, not as pleasing men, but God who tests our hearts. For neither at any time
 did we use flattering words, as you know, nor a cloak for covetousness--God is witness.
 Nor did we seek glory from men, either from you or from others, when we might have
 made demands as apostles of Christ.
- VII) V12 Not with *fleshly wisdom*: Carnal thinking that's not concerned with God's glory Fleshly wisdom is grounded in the flesh: profit, pleasure, and worldly honor It is based on devising plans to promote themselves, not the cause of Jesus
- VIII) Though his detractors said he relied on fleshly wisdom, the fact is that he did not His response: His clean conscience was revealed in simplicity and godly sincerity
- IX) This is something that they could judge by his conduct before them

 He lived out the message that he gave to them, and they saw it very clearly

- I) Paul's life was open, and he loved them, which is why he answered the charges His words and his works lined up, proving he relies on the Lord completely
- II) He now responds to the third lie that had been circulated about him The false teachers were saying he does not speak plainly, and exaggerates HIS ANSWER
- III) V13 We are not writing any other things to you than what you read or understand Ellicott: I have no hidden meaning in what I write, and you read. What you read you read correctly, in its plain and simple sense.
- IV) There are no innuendoes: My speech is straight, and there are no hidden meanings I am not trying to impress people with fantastic stories I am not trying to insert my personal opinions, to make me seem important I am not writing with worldly cunning, and am not evasive in how I minister to you POINT
- V) You can trust what I have told you because I have no hidden motives or agenda I am not fabricating stories to win your admiration, but I am preaching Jesus 1 Co 1:17 For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the gospel, not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of no effect Ro 1:16 I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for
- salvation to everyone who believes, first to the Jew, then to the Greek
- VI) V13 Now I trust you will understand, even to the end I trust you will know that my teachings about Jesus can be trusted to the very end
- VII) V14 As also you have understood us in part

 What I am telling you is something that you have partial knowledge of

 My hope is that in telling you these things, you will understand my value to you
- VIII) V14 we are your boast as you also are ours in the day of the Lord Jesus

 One day you will see that you have as much reason to be proud of me as I have to be proud of you
- IX) When we stand before Jesus, we will be proud of each other

 1 Th 2:19-20 For what is our hope, our joy, or the crown in which we will glory in
 the presence of our Lord Jesus when he comes? Is it not you? Indeed, you are our glory
 and joy.
