- V16-17 INTRO: For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ for it is the power Paul just wrote that he is ready to preach the gospel to the citizens of Rome This is because he desired people come to a saving knowledge of Jesus
- II) In V9 he spoke of how he served God with his spirit in the gospel of His Son As a missionary, Paul took the message and preached it everywhere This is because he was called and separated to the gospel of God
- III) He was aware of his calling, and was obedient to what Jesus had said Mk 16:15 He said to them, Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature.
- IV) Being called and separated to the gospel inspired and fueled him to preach It was like a fire that burned within his soul
  1 Co. 9:16 Yet when I preach the gospel, I cannot boast, for I am compelled to preach. Woe to me if I do not preach the gospel!
- V) People were lost, and people needed God's salvation

  This salvation comes by receiving the message of salvation, by faith

  The message of salvation is found in the gospel

  1 Pe 1:23 Being born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever
- VI) Because it is the message of salvation Paul was not ashamed of the gospel Ashamed: To shrink back; to be confounded
- VII) Paul knew that the gospel revealed God to man but was seen as foolish

  1 Co 1:17-18 For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the gospel,
  not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of no effect. For
  the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who
  are being saved it is the power of God.
- VIII) Though knowing how it was viewed he did not shrink back from proclaiming it It was his burden and desire to share it with all that he could Ps 119:46 I will speak of Your testimonies also before kings, and will not be ashamed
- I) Paul was willing to pay the price to deliver this message, even if harmed

He knew this to be part of his calling

Ac 9:15-16 Go your way: for he (Paul) is a chosen vessel to Me, to bear My name before the Gentiles, and kings, and the children of Israel: For I will show him how great things he must suffer for My name's sake.

- II) Today we can become ashamed because it seems that the world is winning We can be intimidated or embarrassed to be associated with Christianity
- III) Much is done in the name of Jesus that causes us to be slow to speak Screaming TV preachers and odd theatrics cause embarrassment Movies can portray believers as ignorant backwoods bumpkins
- IV) These kinds of things can cause you to remain silent about your faith
  Because of this some pastors have watered down the gospel
  They are afraid of offending sensitive hearers, even in their own churches
- V) A call for repentance, conversion and a warning of final judgment is muted God's holiness and man's sinfulness is not clearly proclaimed
- VI) The desire for a large church can tempt the pastor to water down the word Instead of teaching the full counsel of God, the church becomes a theater Quote by Spurgeon (1834-1892) The devil has seldom done a cleverer thing than hinting to the church that part of their mission is to provide entertainment for the people, with a view to winning them...The time will come when instead of shepherds feeding sheep, they will have clowns entertaining the goats...Jesus pitied sinners, sighed, and wept over them, but never sought to amuse them.
- VII) Teaching and encouraging believers the word of God equips them If we reject doing so, we will end up with a crowd, but not a church
- VIII) Paul was not ashamed because it is the power of God that results in salvation It is God revealing how He saves men and gives them eternal life
- IX) It is not within our own power to change our own nature

  Good works alone is simply dressing up a spiritually dead corpse
- I) We can't change our own nature by good works, rituals, or any human means Change comes through receiving the gospel and being born again

- II) V16 The gospel is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes Changed lives are what truly reveals the power of God: transformation
- III) This is why we remain teaching the scripture
  1 Co 1:16-17 For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the
  gospel—not with wisdom and eloquence, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its
  power. For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing,
  but to us who are being saved it is the power of God
- IV) V16 To the Jew first and also to the Greek

  Before the gospel went to the whole world, it was first taken to the Jews
- V) In obedience to this command, the apostles first went to Jews (Ac 1:8)

  This was because the Jews had a special position, having a hope of Messiah
- VI) From the beginning, when Paul entered a city, he first went to the synagogue Ac 9:20 Paul promptly began to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, declaring He is the Son of God (Ac 13:14)

Ac 17:1-2 When Paul and his companions had passed through Amphipolis and Apollonia, they came to Thessalonica, where there was a Jewish synagogue. As was his custom, Paul went into the synagogue, and on three Sabbaths he reasoned with them from the Scriptures

- VII) From there, the gospel was taken out to the whole world
- VIII) V17 For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith as it is God's plan to make us righteous is revealed in Jesus and His work 2 Co 5:21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
- IX) V17 The righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith
  It is by faith that we receive the gospel, and from faith that we grow in faith
  As it is written The just shall live by faith (Habakkuk 2:4)
- I) Faith in the Old Covenant led to faith in what was revealed in the New: Jesus With this in mind, the gospel is the message that results in salvation

- II) It is the power of God to salvation to everyone who believes

  This is what Martin Luther discovered as he studied Romans
- III) Barend Klaas Kuiper, Martin Luther: The Formative Years:

Luther: I greatly longed to understand Paul's Epistle to the Romans, and nothing stood in the way but that one expression, "the righteousness of God," because I took it to mean that righteousness whereby God is righteous and deals righteously in punishing the unrighteous...Night and day I pondered until...I grasped the truth that the righteousness of God is that righteousness whereby, through grace and sheer mercy, He justifies us by faith. Thereupon I felt myself to be reborn and to have gone through open doors into paradise. The whole of Scripture took on a new meaning, and whereas before "the righteousness of God" had filled me with hate, now it became to me inexpressibly sweet in greater love. This passage of Paul became to me a gateway to heaven.

- IV) V18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and In Rome the average person considered the gospel to be irrelevant With this in mind, Paul begins to unfold the Gospel of God
- V) He begins first by speaking of God's wrath

  The thought of an angry God for many is unacceptable

  They say: If there is a God, He is loving and not judgmental
- VI) V18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness
  Wrath: Indignation; anger revealed in punishment; settled displeasure
  God's wrath is revealed as being against ungodliness and unrighteousness
- VII) It is revealed (made known, visible) against ungodliness and unrighteousness Ungodliness is a lack of reverence for God, unrighteousness is its result
- VIII) Scripture reveals that God will severely punish all sin In the OT, God revealed His wrath on several occasions
- I) Gen 3 It is revealed it in the Garden when He evicted Adam and Eve Gen 6-7 It is revealed when He destroyed the world through a flood Gen 11:1-9 He scattered people and confounded languages Gen 18-19 He destroyed Sodom, Gomorrah, Admah, Bela and Zeboiim

Ex 14 It was revealed when He destroyed Pharoah's armies in the Red Sea

II) The NT also refers to and reveals the wrath of God

Jn 3:36 Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life, but whoever rejects the Son will not see life, for God's wrath remains on him.

Col 3:5-6 Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry. Because of these, the wrath of God is coming.

- III) The seven-year tribulation is a time when God's wrath is poured out
  Rev 6:16-17 (they) said to the mountains and rocks, "Fall on us and hide us
  from the face of Him who sits on the throne and from the wrath of the Lamb! For
  the great day of His wrath has come, and who is able to stand?"
- IV) God's wrath has divine origin, and is poured out on those who deserve it What are they doing that makes them deserve His wrath?
- V) V18 They are suppressing (holding back, restraining) the truth
  They hold back the truth through their wicked efforts and rejection of it
  Jn 3:19-20 This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but men loved
  darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil. Everyone who does evil
  hates the light and will not come into the light for fear that his deeds will be
  exposed.
- VI) This remains true to this day

  There are those who have wealth and influence, and try to stifle truth

  There are also those who resist scripture and refuse to see value in them
- VII) Just last weekend an ad was aired encouraging people to investigate Jesus So much controversy arose over it: it cost around \$20 million to air I didn't hear any uproar over Jeff Bezos's \$500 million superyacht Paul says that they make every effort to restrain the truth from being heard
- I) In these verses, Paul makes it clear that all people deserve to be judged He begins by making a case against Gentiles, who are separated from God This is something that Paul wrote of in Ephesians

Eph 2:12 remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world.

- II) From Ch 2 to Ch. 3:8 he reveals the Jewish nation to also be under sin Then from Ch 3:9-20 he states that both Jew and Gentile deserve judgment
- III) V19 Because that may be known of God is manifest in them for God has Paul made it clear that God has revealed Himself in the gospel
- IV) The gospel communicates clearly what God intends us to know
  This is what is called special revelation
  The fact is: some have not heard the complete revelation of God
- V) Even if they have not heard, they have an innate knowledge of His existence They have reason, moral law and conscience that awakens them
- VI) We are created with an innate knowledge that there is something greater: God This awareness has been given to us by God and doesn't originate within us He gives us what is called general revelation
- V) V19 He has given us a moral compass called a conscience
  He says what may be known of God is manifest in them
  This has been called natural religion
- VII) Eccl 3:11 He has also set eternity in the hearts of men

  This is an awareness of the infinite, and what fuels our lives to seek purpose

  This awareness is what fuels social rules and morals and is our conscience
- VIII) A conscience alone cannot save you

  It is formed over a lifetime and reflects the values taught and caught

  When you violate your conscience, you can feel guilty but not convicted

  It can accuse you, and it can even excuse you
- I) Some people have **blunted** their conscience and cease feeling any guilt
  1 Ti 4:2 speaking lies in hypocrisy, having their own conscience seared with
  a hot iron

II) You can do something that doesn't violate your conscience but is wrong
Your conscience isn't the Spirit and you may still do wrong without guilt
Pr 6:30 People do not despise a thief if he steals to satisfy his hunger when
he is starving

1 Co 4:4 I know nothing against myself, yet I am not justified by this; but He who judges me is the Lord.

- III) V20 For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen Second: He has also revealed His divine nature through creation Creation reveals the invisible attributes of His eternal power and Godhead
- IV) Nature reveals God's incredible power and faithfulness

  Ps 19:1 The heavens declare the glory of God: and the firmament s

Ps 19:1 The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament shows his handiwork.

Ps 104:19 He made the moon to mark the months, and the sun sets according to a regular schedule

Heb 3:4 For every house is built by someone, but He who built all things is God.

- V) V21 Because although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God
  They had a natural awareness of that which is greater: God
  They have conscience (internal) and nature (external), yet they reject God
- VI) Man demonstrates rejection by doing four things
  First: By dishonoring Him and proudly rejecting Him
  Mal 1:6 A son honors his father, And a servant his master. If then I am the
  Father, Where is My honor? And if I am a Master, Where is My reverence?
- VII) Second: By being thankless, that reject Him and do not give Him thanks
  Job 21:15 Who is the Almighty, that we should serve Him, and what would
  we gain if we entreat (pray to) Him?
- I) Third: Futile in their thoughts concerning Him

  This is Paul's explanation concerning the creation of other religions

  Man's search for meaning outside of God results in confusion and vanity

  Eph 4:17-19 So I tell you this, and insist on it in the Lord, that you must no
  longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their thinking. They are darkened in

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their understanding and separated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them due to the hardening of their hearts. Having lost all sensitivity, they have given themselves over to sensuality so as to indulge in every kind of impurity, with a continual lust for more.

- II) Fourth: Their foolish hearts were darkened

  They refuse His Light (spiritual illumination) and now live in moral darkness
  The heart is the core of our being, producing thoughts words and actions
  Darkened means we do whatever we feel like doing, regardless
- III) V22-23 Prpfessomg to be wise they became fools and changed the glory of the When man rejected God's revelation, they became foolish idol worshipers
- IV) Instead of giving God the glory due His name, they gave honor to His creation Jer 2:11-13 Has a nation changed its gods, which are not gods? But My people have changed their Glory for what does not profit. Be astonished, O heavens, at this, and be horribly afraid; Be very desolate," says the LORD. For My people have committed two evils: They have forsaken Me, the fountain of living waters, and hewn themselves cisterns--broken cisterns that can hold no water.
- V) In spite of this God revealed Himself to us in mercy through His Son Jesus Though many of us at one time did not honor Him, we do now!
