- I) V1-5 INTRO: Brethren I do not want you to be unaware (ignorant) that all our REVIEW
- II) In Ch 8, Paul set forth the principle of Christian liberty
 There he contrasted license, legalism, liberty, and love
 1 Co 8:9 gave the boundaries: all things were to be done through Christian love
- III) Ch 9 illustrated for us how the principle of love works in real life
 Though he could receive support, he was willing to serve without it from them
 This was out of love, because his primary concern was to win souls for Christ
 WITH THIS IN MIND
- IV) Ch 8 and 9 illustrate how our exercise of freedom in Christ affects others

 AT THIS POINT
- V) Ch 10 illustrates how our use of liberty affects our own lives
 10:12 IS THE MAIN POINT
- VI) Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall

 Overconfidence in your own abilities will inevitably lead you to fall

 Pr 29:23 A man's pride shall bring him low: but honor shall uphold the humble in spirit

WHAT IS HIS CONCERN

- VII) The Corinthians were in danger of thinking they were beyond stumbling

 They were saved, baptized, well taught, spirit-filled, and maturing in their faith
- VIII) Many thought that they had arrived at full spiritual maturity

 REMEMBER WHAT PAUL WROTE
- IX) 1 Co 1:7 You have every spiritual gift you need as you eagerly wait for the return of our Lord Jesus Christ

SADLY

- X) Some considered themselves very mature and beyond temptation
- XI) Paul had closed ch 9 by encouraging them to remain disciplined in their faith
 He said that ran his race and fought the fight of faith with a mind to win
 Phil 3:13-14 Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I
 do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which
 are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus
- XII) 1 Co 9:27 He said I discipline my body, (literally I bruise my body)

 This was to illustrate the war he fought against the inclinations of his flesh

- I) He not only was conquering his flesh, but was making it a captive
 He was not going to be a servant of his desires, but was conquering them
 He would not be led by his desires, but would be master of his desires
- II) He is emphasizing the depth of the struggle and the fight

 To win the fight requires total commitment to victory over sin's draw

 Heb 12:4 In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood.

WITH THIS IN MIND

- III) He illustrates his exhortation by using examples from Jewish history

 He shares how the nation had many privileges, but had failed to remain faithful
- IV) V1 Moreover brethren I do not want you to be unaware that all our fathers

 AGAIN
- V) Paul had written that he did not want to be disqualified (9:27)

 He wanted to remain usable by the Lord because pride disqualifies from service Pr 18:12 Before his downfall a man's heart is proud, but humility comes before honor

 TO DEVELOP THIS
- VI) Paul uses ancient Israel as an illustration
 He refers to incidents from Israel's 40 year wandering in the wilderness
- VII) V1 Moreover brethren, I do not want you to be unaware that all our fathers **Point**: Don't ignore the lessons of the past
- VIII) Israel had privileges but many did not appreciate and understand their value
 They didn't fully understand the origin of their blessings
 They didn't by faith realize that these blessings were provided by God
 AT THIS POINT
- IX) He gives reminders from Israel's history
 These were people who were blessed by God with many spiritual blessings
 God provided for them, but they did not comprehend His commands
- X) As he rehearses the history of Israel he intends to communicate three key things

 First: All of Israel experienced gracious deliverance from physical bondage

 Second: Those benefits were spiritual in nature

 Third: In reality, those benefits all came from Jesus

 KEY

- I) The reaching out to deliver was initiated by God and motivated by His grace FIRST
- II) V1 All our fathers were under the cloud, all passed through the sea

 He is writing as a Jew to Gentiles who are included in God's blessings
- III) All Jews were physical descendants of Abraham, but he is writing to Gentiles
 Through faith in Jesus, they are now Abraham's spiritual descendants
 Ro 4:11 He received the sign of circumcision, a seal of the righteousness that he had by faith while he was still uncircumcised. So then, he is the father of all who believe but have not been circumcised, in order that righteousness might be credited to them.

Gal 3:7 Therefore know that only those who are of faith are sons of Abraham INTERESTINGLY

- IV) In the first 4 verses, he uses the word all 5 times
 This shows oneness in experience; the nation together experienced these events

 FIRST
- V) V1 All were under the cloud (God delivered the nation: believer and unbeliever)
 God provided protection for the Jews when they fled Egypt

Ex 13:21 By day the LORD went ahead of them in a *pillar of cloud* to guide them on their way and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, so that they could travel by day or night.

Ex 14:20 The cloud settled between the Egyptian and Israelite camps. As darkness fell, the cloud turned to fire, lighting up the night. But the Egyptians and Israelites did not approach each other all night.

SECOND

VI) All passed through the sea: With no distinction, God brought them all to safety God opened up a way through the Red Sea

Ex 14:21-22 Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and all that night the LORD drove the sea back with a strong east wind and turned it into dry land. The waters were divided, and the Israelites went through the sea on dry ground, with a wall of water on their right and on their left.

THIRD

VII) All were *baptized* into Moses: Identified with the faith he delivered to them Ex 14:31 And when the Israelites saw the mighty hand of the LORD displayed against the Egyptians, the people feared the LORD and put their trust in Him and *in Moses His servant*.

FOURTH

VIII) All ate the spiritual food (Manna, manifesting God's grace to provide bread of life)

I) Ex 16:15 And when the children of Israel saw it, they said one to another, It is *manna*: for they knew not what it was. And Moses said to them, This is the bread which the LORD has given you to eat.

JESUS IS BREAD

II) Jn 6:31-35 Our forefathers ate the manna in the desert; as it is written: `He gave them bread from heaven to eat.' "Jesus said to them, "I tell you the truth, it is not Moses who has given you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." "Sir," they said, "from now on give us this bread." Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty.

FIFTH

III) V4 And all drank the same spiritual drink

This occurred at Horeb (desert), also called Mt Sinai)

Ex 17:6 I will stand before you there upon the rock in Horeb; and *you shall smite* the rock, and there shall come water out of it, that the people may drink. And Moses did so in the sight of the elders of Israel.

NOTICE WHAT PAUL SAYS

IV) V4 That Rock was Christ

The presence of Jesus: protecting, guiding, being smitten, refreshing them Jn 7:37-38 In the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink. He that believes on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water.

FACT IS

V) V5 But with most of them God was not well pleased (Only Joshua and Caleb)

Notice their behavior under the heading of rejecting God

They all left Egypt, they all were under God's protection, they all passed through the Red Sea, they all were baptized into Moses, they all ate the spiritual food, they all drank the same spiritual drink but with most of them, God was not well pleased

VI) But with most of them God was not pleased because they journeyed in unbelief Heb 3:19 So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief.

Heb. 4:2 For unto us was the gospel preached, as well as unto them: but the word preached did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in them that heard it.

VII) **Point**: Though deliverance was offered, their hearts remained in Egypt

- V6 Now these things became our examples to the intent that we should not lust Their unbelief, if the face of so much opportunity, serves as a warning Do not long to be satisfied by the things of the world

 HIS WARNING
- II) They are being drawn to the eating, drinking, and fornication practiced in idolatry
- III) V7-9 And do not become idolaters as were some of them As it is written The He tells us that they did four things

FIRST

IV) V7 They became **idolaters** constructing and dancing before the golden calf Ex 32:1-6, 15-28

SECOND

V) V8 Fornicated (unlawful sexual intercourse)

Nu 25:1-3 While Israel was staying in Acacia grove, the men began to indulge in sexual immorality with Moabite women, who invited them to the sacrifices to their gods. The people ate and bowed down before these gods. So Israel yoked themselves to the Baal of Peor. And the Lord's anger burned against them.

THIRD

- VI) V9 They tempted Christ and were destroyed by serpents

 They tempted Jesus by not trusting the Lord to provide for them

 Nu 21:5-6 they spoke against *God* and against *Moses*, and said, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the desert? There is no bread! There is no water!

 And we detest this miserable food!" Then the LORD sent venomous snakes among them; they bit the people and many Israelites died.
- VII) Nu 21:9 Moses made a bronze serpent, and put it on a pole; and so it was, if a serpent had bitten anyone, when he looked at the bronze serpent, he lived.
- VIII) The serpent brought death, so Moses made a bronze symbol of the serpent As they looked at the serpent, they understood it was a picture of their judgment
- IX) By obediently looking at the serpent, they understood their judgment They also understood their source of healing: God
- X) Many years later Jesus used this as an illustration while speaking to Nicodemus Jn 3:14-15 As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up so that whoever believes will in Him have eternal life.

I) FOURTH

- II) V10 No murmuring, which speaks of grumbling and complaining
 Nu 16: Korah, Dathan, Abiram, and 250 leaders and influential followers rebelled
 against Moses, accusing him of setting himself above the Lord's assembly
- III) As a result were judged by God

The earth opened up and swallowed Korah, Dathan and Abiram; fire consumed the 250 influential leaders, and a plague killed 14,700 of their sympathizers

WHY THIS PARTICULAR WARNING

- IV) The Corinthians were in danger of duplicating this sin, also People challenged Paul even as Korah challenged Moses (1 Co 9:1-2)
- V) Under the influence of the false apostles, some were rejecting Paul
 The only thing that can undermine the church is the church itself
- VI) God hates murmuring because it is divisive

Pr. 6:16-19 These six things does the LORD hate: yes, seven are an abomination unto him: A proud look, a lying tongue, and hands that shed innocent blood, An heart that devises wicked imaginations, feet that be swift in running to mischief, A false witness that speaks lies, and he that sows discord among brethren.

HIS POINT

- VII) The warning is simple: the Israelites longed for the things left behind in Egypt Egypt is a picture of the world, and their hearts remained in Egypt
- VIII) The Corinthians must not long for the things of their world

 Eating, drinking, and sexual sins are not to be longed for
 Instead of hungering for the old life, pursue the blessings of the new one
- IX) V11 All these things happened to them as examples and they were written for our These things happened to Israel and should serve to warn us

 We are nearing the completion of all things and should be alert

 HIS POINT
- X) V12-13 Therefore let him who thinks (is confident) he stands take heed lest he fall Point: Keep a close watch on yourself so do not become overconfident
- XI) Israel had great advantages, but not all were saved

'25 1 CO 10:1-13 OVERCONFIDENCE 12/17/25

- I) Do not take salvation for granted, keep close watch on your soul Take heed and walk carefully in this world of spiritual landmines Peter was very confident, and yet he stumbled in his walk with Jesus
- II) Laodicea was, and the church itself ultimately ceased to exist

 Rev 3:17 Because you say, 'I am rich, have become wealthy, and have need of nothing'--and do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked--
- III) V13 No temptation has overtaken you You do not go through any unique inducements to sin
- IV) God has made a way of escape and strenthens you to endure and overcome Victory is available, but we must humbly reach out to Christ for it
- V) We will have times of testing, but we can overcome
 Ps 66:10 For You, O God, have proved us: You have tried us, as silver is tried.
 Pr 17:3 The refining pot is for silver, and the furnace for gold: but the LORD tries the hearts.
