- I) V21-28 INTRO: Then they went into *Capernaum* and immediately on the Sabbath He
- II) Mark began his presentation of his gospel by first revealing Jesus as the Son of God

He is the One that the prophets wrote about (Malachi and Isaiah)

He is the One that is the Anointed Messiah

He is the One that resisted and overcame the Temptations of the enemy

- III) As we have seen, Jesus came with a simple and direct message
 Repent and believe in the gospel
 Repent, and trust in what the message of redemption declares
- IV) The message of redemption when truly believed produces a transformed life

 This is the message that God intends for all generations to hear

 Because of this, Jesus began selecting men to entrust His message with
- V) As we saw, Jesus selected four men to come and follow Him

 He said to Simon, Andrew, James and John Follow Me, I will make you
 fishers of men
- VI) The response on the part of all four of them was immediate

 They left their nets and followed Him, without making excuses or delay

 When God calls, we should respond immediately
- VII) You see this in the call of Abram (Abraham)

Gen 12:1-4 Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go forth from your country, And from your relatives And from your father's house, To the land which I will show you; And I will make you a great nation, And I will bless you, And make your name great; And so you shall be a blessing; And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse.

And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed." So Abram went forth as the Lord had spoken to him; and Lot went with him. Now Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran.

- VIII) You also see this is the life of Paul (the most famous conversion in history)
 Paul was authorized by the high priest to arrest followers of Jesus
 While on the road to Damascus, Jesus arrested him
- IX) His encounter with Jesus left him unable to see

 He was told to go to the house of Ananias in Damascus, and Ananias prayed for him
- X) Saul was healed of his blindness, and the transformation was immediate Ac 9:20 *Immediately* he preached the Christ in the synagogues, that He is the Son

- I) There was no delay in these men: they left everything to follow Jesus In their case it was a profitable business
- II) This reminds us of a man named Matthew, a wealthy tax collector that Jesus called
- Mt 2:14 As He passed by, He saw Levi (Matthew) the son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax office. And He said to Him, Follow Me. So he arose and followed Him
- III) The call to follow Jesus was specific, as He was assembling His apostles

 The call can also be general, as He calls people everywhere to follow Him

 Lu 9:23 Then he said to *them all*: Whoever wants to be my disciple must
 deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me.
- IV) Some refuse to follow Him, thinking about all they might be giving up Instead, we should consider all that we will gain
 Jn 12:26 Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me.
- V) In the case of James and John, it included leaving their father Zebedee
 They were willing to leave everything, putting Jesus first
- VI) At this time, they would not have understood clearly what they would gain
 Mt 19:29 And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or
 father or mother or wife or children or fields for my sake will receive a hundred
 times as much and will inherit eternal life
- VII) Incidentally, this is something every believer has gained, sometimes without valuing it
- VIII) Jesus called these men to follow Him, and now we see Jesus demonstrating authority

He will demonstrate His spiritual authority as He teaches God's word

He will also reveal His authority as He casts out a demon

IX) In these verses we see a contrast between how people react, and how demons react

The people are amazed, interested and intrigued at the manner in which Jesus taught

X) On the other hand, the demons are aware of Who He is, and are terrified

The people were curious, but the demons reacted loudly to Who He was

They knew Jesus was their Judge, but the people did not

XI) V21-22 Then they went into *Capernaum* and immediately on the Sabbath He entered

Jesus is in Galilee: Capernaum is a city on the NW coastline of the Sea of Galilee

It was a prosperous fishing village located on the major highway from the W to the E

- I) Capernaum is translated the village of Nahum

 This may be a reference to it being the hometown of an OT prophet named Nahum
- II) The word Nahum is translated consolation, or compassion

 Some commentators think this refers to the character of the villagers:
 compassionate
- III) It could also give us insight into Jesus and His compassionate ministry
 Mk 1:40-41
 It would be appropriate that our compassionate Savior live in a village of
 Compassion
- IV) Capernaum was where Simon Peter, Andrew, James and John lived
 Mt 4:13-16 says Capernaum became His headquarters after He was
 rejected in Nazareth
- V) V21 He immediately entered the synagogue and taught
- VI) We use the word synagogue today but perhaps need to know what it is Literally, a synagogue is the place of gathering together
- VII) The practice of going to synagogue began during the Babylonian captivity
 The Babylonians destroyed and ransacked the Temple in 586 BC
 While in Babylon the Jews began to gather for religious meetings in synagogues
- VIII) The Temple remained the center of Jewish life, but many Jews lived many miles away

Synagogue was place of worship, study, community fellowship, and even legal court

They could be formed anywhere there were at least 10 Jewish men

IX) Over time, Synagogue became very important in Jewish community life

It served as a public school for boys, where they studied the Talmud
(oral tradition of the Law), as well as writing, reading, and arithmetic.

For men, it was the center of advanced Theological training

X) V21 Mark tells us *immediately* on the Sabbath He entered the synagogue and taught

This was not unusual for Jesus because He had the habit of attending synagogue

- XI) V21 Jesus entered the synagogue and *taught*There was something called the freedom of the synagogue

 This made it possible for any qualified man to deliver a teaching from the

 OT
- XII) This freedom was also extended to visiting rabbis, and Jesus was becoming known

Lu 4:14-15 Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit to Galilee and new of Him went out through all the surrounding region And He taught in their synagogues being glorified by all

I) Teaching God's word was part of the ministry Jesus performed amongst the people

His ministry was revealed by teaching, preaching, and healing
Mt 4:23 Jesus went about all Galilee, *teaching* in their synagogues,
preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and *healing* all kinds of sickness and all kinds of
disease among the people.

- II) The reason that He taught was so that they might discover who He was He taught the OT because God's Word points to Jesus
- III) Mark made this clear in his introduction by quoting Malachi and Isaiah

 This is something that is of utmost importance: it is God's word that
 points to Jesus

Jn 5:39 Search the scriptures; for in them you think you have eternal life: and they are they which testify of Me.

IV) It is God's Word, rightly divided, taught and proclaimed that brings people to salvation

This is why Jesus *taught* and *preached* God's Word and didn't rely on His miracles

Jn 5:45-47 Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father: there is one that accuses you, even Moses, in whom you trust. For had you believed Moses, you would have believed Me: for he wrote of Me. But if you believe not his writings, how shall you believe My words?

Ro 10:17 Faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God

V) V22 And they were astonished at his teaching for He taught them as one having authority

VI) They were astonished at His teaching

ASTONISHED: This is a very strong word: It means to be struck with amazement

They were amazed at the way Jesus spoke to them

- VII) He taught them with spiritual and moral authority, and not like the scribes

 Scribes: Religious experts whose normal manner of teaching was to quote other Rabbis
- VIII) The Scribes were held in high honor in Jewish society
 They were the authority on questions of faith and practice in Moses' law
- IX) The key: Scribes did not exercise their own authority

 They didn't give independent judgments but quoted other Rabbi's as authorities

 They would did not exercise personal authority but referred to the traditions
- X) JESUS' TEACHING: Was direct, personal and filled with heavenly authority
 Mt 5: The Sermon on the Mount demonstrates this: You have heard it
 said...but I tell you
- I) His approach to teaching would have caused quite a stir amongst the people He did not quote others, but presented Himself as the absolute authority
- II) Jesus taught with an authority from heaven
 Jn 12:49-50 For I have not spoken on My own authority; but the Father who
 sent Me gave Me a command, what I should say and what I should speak; and I know
 that His command is everlasting life. Therefore, whatever I speak, just as the Father has
 told Me, so I speak."
- Ill) He was from heaven and could speak as an eyewitness

 Jn 3:31-34 He who comes from above is above all; he who is of the earth is earthly and speaks of the earth. He who comes from heaven is above all. And what *He has seen* and *heard*, that He testifies; and no one receives His testimony. He who has received His testimony has certified that God is true. For He whom God has sent *speaks the words of God*, for God does not give the Spirit by measure.
- IV) V23-24 Now there was a man in their synagogue with an unclean spirit

- V) As Jesus was teaching, a demonized man cried out in recognition of Who Jesus is

 He interrupted Jesus and began literally shrieking at Him
- VI) The OT does not give us instances of demonic possession It is in the NT that we see such a thing
- VII) Acts gives us two examples:

Ac 16:16-18 speaks of a girl in Philippi with the spirit of divination
Ac 19:11-16 speaks of Paul delivering demonized people, and the 7 sons of
Sceva

- VIII) It is in the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke that we see accounts of demons When they encountered Jesus, they would reveal themselves in various ways
- IX) In this instance the demon began to scream at the top of his lungs
- X) V23 Mark tells us that this man had an unclean spirit

 This demon drove him to impurity, vulgarity, and a sexually filthy lifestyle
- XI) As He is teaching, a demon possessed man makes his presence known
- XII) V23-24 He *cried* out let us alone (This speaks of wonder mixed with fear)

 To raise a cry from the depth of the throat (the demon used the man's vocal chords)

THIS GIVES US INSIGHT: Demons actually go to church

- I) He is in a state or terror: Let us alone! What have we to do with You?

 As a fallen angel, this demon is like Satan, foul and rejecting God's holy authority
- II) The demon recognizes Jesus and instantly makes it clear they have nothing in common

The demon is impure and provoked this man to a filthy life He is the opposite of Jesus, and has nothing in common with Him

- III) Jesus is pure and would set him free to live a pure life

 Heb 7:26 For it was fitting for us to have such a high priest (Jesus), holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners and exalted above the heavens
- IV) They have nothing in common

 Jn 14:30 I will no longer talk much with you, for the ruler of this world is coming, and he has nothing in Me.
- V) As followers of Jesus, we too are to have nothing in common with them

2 Co 6:14-15 Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness? What harmony is there between Christ and Belial? What does a believer have in common with an unbeliever?

VI) V24 Notice that he calls Him Jesus of Nazareth

disdain

Because of its poor reputation and insignificance, this is used as a word of

He is actually showing Jesus disrespect

VII) V24 Did you come to destroy us? (Are You going to lock us up in eternal judgment, now)

Demons know that Jesus was sent to accomplish

1 Jn 3:8 the Son of God appeared for this purpose, to destroy the works of the devil

- VIII) He wanted to know if Jesus was about to do that work at that moment The answer to that question is yes, but not now
- IX) V24 I *know* who You are (Demons know exactly who Jesus is)

 Jas 2:19 You believe that there is one God. You do well. Even the demons believe—and tremble!

This has been called demon faith

- X) They know who He is because He created the angelic host before they fell Col 3:16 By Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through Him and for Him.
- I) When Satan rebelled he drew some of the angels with him

 Rev 12:4 (Satan) His tail drew a third of the stars of heaven and threw them
 to the earth.

These fallen angels *know* Who Jesus is but it does not save them!

- II) Knowing Who Jesus is does not save a person Receiving the gift of salvation does
- III) As He is teaching, He has the opportunity to set a captive free
 This is what He had been sent to do

Ac 10:38 God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were *under the power of the devil*, because God was with him.

IV) V24 You are the Holy One of God

The demon was fully aware of Jesus' divine authority, and greatly feared
Him

- V) The spirit that was energizing the possessed man was fully revealed

 The voice behind the mask was exposed, and the people fully saw it
- VI) V25 But Jesus rebuked him saying *Be quiet* and come out of him There was no holy water, smoke, ritual or intense screaming
- VII) There was simply two commands: Be quiet, and come out of him

 The first command silenced the devil and the second drove him out
- VIII) Jesus wanted no testimony from Demons! He was not in league with Satan
 This would later become an accusation concerning Him
 Lu 11:18-20 If Satan also is divided against himself, how will his
 kingdom stand? Because you say I cast out demons by Beelzebub. And if I cast out
 demons by Beelzebub, by whom do your sons cast *them* out? Therefore they will be
 your judges. But if I cast out demons with the finger of God, surely the kingdom of God
 has come upon you.
- IX) V26 And when the unclean spirit had convulsed him and cried out with a loud voice
- X) This evil spirit could not resist harming this man one last time

 He knew he had to leave, but he did so in a way to further injure him
- XI) Later in Mark, we will see something similar occur when Jesus delivered a young boy

His father brought him to Jesus, and Jesus delivered him

Mk 9:26 The spirit cried out convulsed him greatly, and came out of him.

And he became as one dead so that many said he is dead

- I) It seems to me that when the devil loses someone, he might injure them one last time
- II) V27-28 Then they were all amazed so that they questioned among themselves saying
- III) Imagine what the people are thinking

 They are in their expression of a church service when this took place

 Screaming, Jesus identified, stern commanding, convulsion, deliverance, calm
- IV) The people are left in stunned silence as they begin to whisper amongst themselves

What is this? What new doctrine is this?

V) His teaching already awakened us to His scriptural depth, command, and insight

But His work of delivering the one in bondage to Satan is more amazing Even the things we fear most deeply are subject to Him!

VI) These people were now left with no excuse:

Even so, the city ultimately rejected Him as their Lord and Savior Their amazement, in the end, was worthless because they did not receive

Him

VII) V28 Immediately His fame began to spread throughout all the region around Galilee

Still, word got out and others heard of Jesus
