- I) V7-10 INTRO: Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you *REVIEW*
- II) James has been dealing with division in the churches
 Wars (quarrels) and fights (strife) began to be commonplace

 JAMES MADE IT CLEAR
- III) This kind of behavior in the church revealed carnality and a spiritual immaturity This is what is called the works of the flesh as listed in Gal 5:19-21 The works of the flesh include selfish ambition, dissensions, and contentions
- IV) These kinds of works were behind the church wars that had arisen It was something that had to be addressed or it would undermine the work THE FACT IS
- V) Division in the church began very early in its history **DEVELOP**
- VI) When the church was birthed at Pentecost, God began moving in powerful ways Ac 2 records how Peter preached a powerful message on the Day of Pentecost He had been baptized in the Spirit, and began to preach to the crowd
- VII) Ac 2:41 tells us around three thousand souls were saved on that day

 These new believers continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and
 fellowship, the breaking of bread, and in prayers and the result was many more people
 came to know Jesus
 - Ac 2:47 says the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved THE SPIRIT WAS MOVING POWERFULLY
- VIII) Ac 3 records how Peter and John performed a healing on a crippled man

 The result of this miracle was that Peter was able to preach to the crowd

 Ac 4:4 tells us that many who heard the word believed, and the number of the

 men came to be about five thousand
- IX) The church was exploding with many being saved and many miracles performed By ch 5, opposition to the gospel arose and the apostles began to be persecuted They were arrested, beaten, and forbidden to speak in the name of Jesus
- X) Instead of closing their mouths, they rejoiced that they suffered for Jesus
 This did not stop them from preaching but energized them to continue doing so
 THE BELIEVERS DREW CLOSER
- XI) The devil did not succeed by instigating persecution from the outside

I) Because of this, he inspired opposition that created division from within

This is an age old tactic of Satan: divide and conquer

Mk 3:24-25 If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand

ACTS 6 REPORTS THE FIRST DIVISION

- II) A division developed between cultural Jews and culturally Greek Jews
 The division related to how widows were being treated differently
 The Hellenized Jewish widows were being neglected in the daily distribution
- III) The division led to the formation of deacons who served in church leadership What Satan intended for evil God used for good It had led to the formation of better ministry to those who were in need TWO MORE EXAMPLES
- IV) In Corinth, division became a problem Paul had to address
 1 Co 1:11 It has been declared to me concerning you, my brethren, by those of
 Chlore's household that there are contentions (quarrels) among you
- V) In Galatia, under the influence of false teachers, division began to develop Gal 5:15-16 But if you bite and devour one another, beware lest you be consumed by one another! I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh.
- VI) With that said, carnality and division in the church began early in its history This divisiveness is what James is dealing with in his letter
- VII) He said that there were wars and fights among them, and he rebuked them for this **WHY**
- VIII) Because love for Jesus results in unity, not divisions amongst believers
 Eph 4:3 (we are to) endeavor to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.
 Ro 12:18 If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men.
 ON ONE HAND
- IX) Faith in Jesus can result in a division between friends and family
 This is something that Jesus prepared His followers for
 Mt 10:34-36 Do not think that I came to bring peace on earth. I did not come to
 bring peace but a sword. For I have come to `set a man against his father, a daughter
 against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law'; and `a man's
 enemies will be those of his own household.

THIS IS PART OF BEING A CHRISTIAN

- I) This kind of division is between **Christians** and those who **reject Jesus**
- II) People can resent having friends leave them and then condemn their faith in Jesus This division is the result of Christians being rejected by non believers
- III) This division is common in the world, but is not to be common in the church This is not birthed by the Holy Spirit, but by the sinful flesh of man
- IV) Because of their carnality, James called them adulterers and adulteresses (V4)

 This is because they had adopted the world's system as their standard

 In doing so it revealed an unfaithful heart towards the Lord
- V) How divisions do you think occur over the church loving and serving too much?

 How many divisions occur because the people are too kind, caring and forgiving

 WHAT IS THE ANSWER
- V) V6 But He gives more grace

 James pointed out that, instead of judgment God actually provides His grace

 Without His grace, the church would never accomplish what it was intended to do
- VI) It is through His grace that we can master our carnality *THE FACT IS*
- VII) It requires humility to receive the grace that is offered by God
 God's grace to us gives us opportunity and time to repent and turn to Him
 QUESTION
- VIII) How are the churches, as well as modern believers, to overcome carnality What must we do to experience and obtain His favor?
- IX) V7 Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you Since God opposes the proud, giving grace to the humble, we submit to Him Instead of resisting God, we must submit ourselves to Him
- X) James says that the unfaithfulness of the believers is due to the enemy's influence **Submit:** A voluntary attitude of yielding, cooperating, or assuming responsibility **Submission** is the yielding of one's will to God, which leads to obeying Him
- XI) In the attitude of humility, yield to what He has said is necessary for our good (V6) It is when we submit to God that we are able to resist the Devil

- I) We resist (withstand; oppose) the devil instead of resisting God's will for us!
- II) We do this *in faith*, being aware that we are in spiritual war Eph 6:10-11 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

2 Co 10:4 For the weapons of our warfare *are* not carnal but *mighty in God* for pulling down strongholds

- III) Submitting to God keeps you from yielding to the draw of the devil and your flesh When you yield to God, you will resist yielding to the devil in anything
- IV) Being under God's protection and trusting in Him results in victory over Satan 1 Jn 5:18 We know that those who have become part of God's family do not make a practice of sinning, for God's Son holds them securely, and the evil one cannot get his hands on them.
- V) V8 Draw near to God and He will draw near to you In setting their hearts on pleasure, they have ceased drawing near to God
- VI) **Quote**: When a soul sets out to seek God, God sets out to meet that soul; so that while we are drawing near to him, he is drawing near to us.
- VII) Ro 12:1-2 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God
- VIII) What are we as believers to do in order to draw near to God?
- V8 Cleanse your hands you sinners; and purify your hearts you double-minded Cleanse your hands: Clean up your lives

 Purify your hearts: Make pure your thoughts, passions, desires, and purposes
- X) V9 Lament and mourn and weep. Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your James calls them to **genuine repentance** and gives insight into what it looks like

- I) There are many who think they have repented when in fact, they really haven't They may have remorse, or regret but have not truly turned away from their sin
- II) James tells us what repentance looks like

III) Lament: To grieve, to be miserable

Mourn: A passionate sorrow of heart that is obvious

Mt 5:4 Blessed are those who mourn: for they shall be comforted.

Weep: Strong tears

Lu 6:21 Blessed are you who weep now: for you shall laugh

- IV) V9 Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to gloom
- V) Become sober minded and take sin seriously, and guard your walk with Jesus!

 1 Th 5:6 Therefore let us not sleep, as others do, but let us watch and be sober.

 1 Pe 5:8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour.

KEY

- VI) This results from seeing sin for what it is, and what is has done to humanity
- VII) V10 Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord and He will lift you up We have sinned against God, so we humble ourselves before Him
- VIII) Mourners lay on the ground, and rolled themselves in the dust. When pardoned, they arose from the earth, shook themselves from the dust, and clothed themselves in their better garments.

Is 57:15 For this is what the high and exalted One says-- he who lives forever, whose name is holy: "I live in a high and holy place, but also with the one who is contrite and lowly in spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly and to revive the heart of the contrite.

- IX) V11 Do not speak evil of one another, brethren. He who speaks evil of a brother Instead of engaging in wars and fights, humble yourselves and live in peace Do not gossip and backbite one another, because you are family in Jesus
- X) Peace and unity are evidences that you belong to Jesus
 This is all built on the foundation of loving God, and loving one another

- V11 He who speaks evil of a brother and judges his brother speaks evil of the law Both the Law and teachings of Jesus forbid believers from judging harshly By disregarding God's word, you are saying that it is not true and you are above it
- II) The Law of Moses is summed up in loving God and one another Gal 5:14-16 For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." But if you bite and devour one another, beware lest you be consumed by one another! I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh.
- III) To say we love God without loving others shows we don't understand Christianity
 1 Jn 4:7-8 Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who
 loves is born of God and knows God. He who does not love does not know God, for God
 is love.
- IV) Love is the willingness to sacrifice one's interest on behalf of others

 This is best demonstrated by God's willingness to send Jesus to die on the cross
- V) This kind of love is the love that God gives us, and empowers us to give to others Jn 15:12-13 This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends.
- VI) Love is the birthmark of the Christian, identifying us as God's children
 This kind of love is what God uses to reach those who are yet to know Him
 Jn 13:34-35 A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I
 have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My
 disciples, if you have love for one another
- VII) If you ask a non-Christian to describe a Christian the answers would be interesting Many of the respondents would say something negative about believers Some would describe us by what we are mad about, or what we are against
- VIII) Swindol: One of the most profound comments made regarding the early church came from the lips of a man named Aristides, sent by the Emperor Hadrian to spy out those strange creatures known as "Christians." Having seen them in action, Aristides returned with a mixed report. But his immortal words to the emperor have echoed down through history: "Behold! How they love one another."

- I) If you humble yourself and love one another, peace will move in the church
- II) V11 Do not speak evil of one another
 This will keep you from speaking evil of one another
 THE FACT IS
- III) By destroying with the tongue, God's love is not exhibited

 Slander destroys 3 people: The speaker, the 1 spoken to and the 1 spoken of Pr 16:28 A perverse man stirs up dissension, and a gossip separates close friends.
- IV) Instead of tearing one another down, we will begin to build one another up Eph 4:31-32 Get rid of all bitterness, rage, and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.
- V) V11 Not speaking evil refers to any form of speech against a person

 This includes speaking what may be true, but with a heart to hurt another
- VI) Christians arae different: We are to encourage and love one another

 Our goal should be grace, love, truth, and unity and our speech should reveal this
- VII) Our goal as believers must be for the body of Christ to be edified and unified
 This obviously would be evidenced by the way we speak of and to one another
 Pr 16:24 Pleasant words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones
- VIII) To love someone is a decision we make through the power of God's Spirit
- IX) We all know people who are very difficult to love

 Love is not only an emotion; it is a decision that is acted upon out of obedience

 Without God's help and a desire to obey Him, it is simply not going to happen
- X) V11 Again, by speaking evil and judging we are speaking evil of the Law of Moses
 The one violating it places himself above it and becomes the ultimate authority
- XI) V12 There is one lawgiver who is able to save and to destroy. Who are you to In your being a critic of your brother, you have usurped God's right to judge

I) God is the ultimate judge, and God judges fairly

He has all of the facts, and is the only One who can judge righteously

Pr 16:2 All the ways of a man are pure in his own eyes, but the LORD weighs the spirits.

Jer 17:9-10 The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked; Who can know it? I, the LORD, search the heart, I test the mind, even to give every man according to his ways, according to the fruit of his doings.

- II) V12 So James asks: Who are you to judge another We see the outside, but can never know the thoughts, motives, or intentions
- III) We are not and cannot be the final judge: only God can be Pr 21:2 Every way of a man is right in his own eyes, But the Lord weighs the hearts.

Jer 17:10 I the Lord search the heart and examine the mind, to reward each person according to their conduct, according to what their deeds deserve

- IV) Constant criticism will only destroy the Church
- V) Instead of destroying, God help us to uplift and encourage one another Ro 14:4 Who are you to judge another's servant? To his own master he stands or falls. Indeed, he will be made to stand, for God is able to make him stand
