- I) V1-2 INTRO: And again He began to teach by the sea. And a great multitude was gathered
- II) In ch 1 Mark began his gospel by introducing us to John the Baptist
 He quoted Malachi and Isaiah in order to reveal that John was Jesus'
 forerunner
- III) Malachi wrote of the Messenger who would prepare the way for Messiah Isaiah called the people to prepare their own hearts to receive Messiah
- IV) After introducing John, Mark went on to introduce Jesus
- V) He began by speaking of His baptism and anointing by the Holy Spirit
 When Jesus was baptized, His Father gave witness of Who He is
 Mk 1:11 A voice came from heaven You are My beloved Son, in whom I
 am well pleased
- VI) With this introduction, Jesus was revealed as Israel's long-awaited Messiah Jesus is Mashiach, the Christ, the anointed One: Messiah Ac 10:38 (Peter said that) God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him.
- VII) Interestingly, demons were well aware of just who He was

 Mk 1:24 (Demonized man in synagogue) spoke and said Let us alone!

 What have we to do with You, Jesus of Nazareth? Did You come to destroy us? I
 know who You are—the Holy One of God!
- VIII) As we see, Jesus went about doing good and attracting multitudes

 He cleansed lepers, performed miracles, cast out demons, and even forgave sins

His preaching was so attractive that crowds formed wherever He taught

- IX) His teaching was filled with power and authority

 Mk 1:22 They were astonished at His teaching for He taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes

 Jn 7:46 "No one ever spoke the way this man does," the guards replied.
- X) All of this was amazing, but not everyone thought it was good

 The Pharisees began to see in Jesus a problem: He was undermining their traditions
- XI) Jesus was performing miracles on the Sabbath, and this was considered sinful

He also forgave sins, which they considered blasphemy

- XII) All of what Jesus was doing was amazing and attractive, yet people still rejected Him
- I) Everything pointed to Him being Messiah, and yet many rejected Him Jn 1:11 (Amplified Bible) He came to that which was His own [that which belonged to Him—His world, His creation, His possession], and those who were His own [people—the Jewish nation] did not receive and welcome Him.
- II) His power was undeniable, His miracles amazing and His preaching authoritative

Yet there were those who refused to receive Him

- III) His apostles (as well as His disciples) may have wondered why this was happening
- V2 To answer this question, Jesus began to teach them many things by parables
- IV) You might find it interesting to know that Jesus often communicated through stories
 - Approximately 1/3 of Jesus' recorded teachings were given as parables Scholars differ on the amounts of parables He gave: They are between
- V) The word *parable* speaks of placing of one thing by the side of another, for comparison

37-39

It has been defined as an earthly story containing a heavenly meaning Through stories, God uses the familiar to communicate the unfamiliar

- VI) Jesus used Parables in His teaching to share insights into the Kingdom of God
 They reveal kingdom truth, give doctrine, and develop Spiritual
 understanding
- VII) It has been said that parables are like mirrors and windows

 We see ourselves in them, and they help us see life through them
- VIII) In scripture, they were intended to both conceal and to reveal (V11-12)

 The uninterested would hear the parable but not consider it deeply
- IX) The one with a spiritual hunger would think of it and search out its meaning Pr 25:2 It is the glory of God to conceal a matter, But the glory of kings is to search out a matter.

- X) SADLY: The same message that awakened one person hardened the other In this passage, Jesus begins to teach many things by using parables
- XII) V1 And again He began to teach by the sea. And a great multitude was gathered
- XIII) As we begin, Jesus is on the shore of the Sea of Galilee

 Many have assembled to hear Him teach

 Once again, because of the great crowd Jesus gets into a boat (Mk 3:9)
- I) V2 As the crowd assembles on the shore, Jesus begins to teach them many things
- II) With so many present, why didn't He begin by performing miracles

 This is something that Mark has been clearly reporting on: Jesus was a miracle worker
- III) Part of the reason would be that believing in *miracles* does not save a person

 The miracle drew attention to the miracle worker, the message drew
 people to salvation
- IV) Remember: Mark made it clear that after John was imprisoned, Jesus came preaching

Mk 1:15 The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel

It has been said that the way into a man's heart is through his ears

V) Preaching and teaching the gospel is God's way of bringing people to salvation

Ro 1:16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek

- VI) I read recently that In 2009, 77% of Americans claimed to be Christians By 2019, only 65% claimed to be Christian
- VII) During the pandemic one in three practicing Christians stopped attending church
- VIII) Today for many, the idea of preaching and teaching is considered ineffective

We look back and see there have been centuries of preaching and

teaching the gospel

IX) Christians speak and write millions of words daily, yet there seems to be little results

This has discouraged pastors from teaching God's word
This has also impressed church attenders that church services are not
necessary

X) Many have ceased claiming to be Christian and others have left church, forever

Should this cause believers and bible teachers to cease teaching?

- XI) The question is: Has God's word lost its power? Is our preaching useless?
- XII) Not everybody sees the value of the message and the God who authored it

 There are many who believe that the preaching of salvation is a joke
 1 Co 1:18 The message of the cross is foolishness to those who are
 perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.
- XIII) Today, the thing that is troubling is that many professing Christians don't value it
- They reject the Bible's authority and refuse to do what scripture teaches

 Note: They reject the Bible's authority and refuse to do what scripture teaches

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- 2 Ti 4:3-4 For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers; and they will turn their ears away from the truth and be turned aside to fables.
- II) We are definitely living in such times
- III) Even the church has decided that there are better ways to reach people SPURGEON: I do believe we slander Christ when we think we are to draw the people by something (other than) the preaching of Christ crucified
- IV) For centuries the gospel has been preached, but not all hearing it have responded

This parable gives us insight into the missing ingredient when it comes to God's Word

V) V2 Then He taught them many things by parables and said to them in His teaching

It is interesting to note that Jesus often communicated by the use of

It is interesting to note that Jesus often communicated by the use of

Approximately 1/3 of Jesus' recorded teachings come through His parables

stories

- VI) Throughout the NT, Jesus often gave instruction by the use of Parables Scholars differ on the amounts of parables He gave but they are between 37-39
- VII) The word parable is something that all Christians are familiar with But just what is the definition of the word?
- VIII) Parable speaks of placing one thing by the side of another in order to make a comparison

It has been defined as an earthly story containing a heavenly meaning
Through the use of parables God uses the familiar to communicate the
unfamiliar

- IX) Jesus used Parables in His teaching to share insights into the Kingdom of God
 They reveal kingdom truth, provide doctrine, and develop Spiritual
 understanding
- X) It has been said that they are mirrors and windows

 We see ourselves in them, and they help us to see life through them
- XI) Jesus used parables to both conceal, reveal, and fulfill
- XII) CONCEAL: From those who were not interested or hungry

 Lazy listeners filled with unbelief would not care to seek for the deeper application

The uninterested would hear the parable but not consider it deeply

I) REVEAL: To those who are hungry for God's Kingdom and are pursuing Him
Pr 25:2 It is the glory of God to conceal a matter, but the glory of kings
is to search out a matter

Mt 5:6 Blessed are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness for they shall be filled

- II) FULFILL: An example of this is V12, which fulfilled Isaiah 6:9-10
- III) Jesus used parables to communicate things concerning the kingdom of God

They were interesting, easy to remember, and easy to apply

- IV) In an atmosphere of hostility, it separates the true follower from opponents
- V) Finally, Jesus gave these parables in order to prepare His disciples for their mission

Believers are to be busy preaching the gospel until Jesus returns

VI) V1-2 And again He began to teach by the sea. And a great multitude was gathered to Him

Great multitudes gather together to listen to Him teach

VII) One would think that He would teach a very clear and understandable message to them

If He were to make it too demanding or too difficult to understand they may leave!

VIII) Instead of making it easier, Jesus seems to have made it more difficult for them

Mark makes it clear that this time, He spoke *only in* parables (V33) In doing this He pruned out the ones who were not sincerely interested

- IX) V3-9 *LISTEN*: Behold, a sower went out to sow And it happened as he sowed that some
- X) Notice how Jesus began by telling His listeners to listen, or to pay attention
 He was making it clear that what was to follow would not be easy to
 understand
- It requires a hunger and a diligence of heart

 Pr 3:3-5 if you call out for *insight* and cry aloud for *understanding*, and if you look for it as for silver and search for it as for hidden treasure, then you will understand the fear of the LORD and find the knowledge of God.
- XII) V3 Listen Behold a sower went out to sow
 A man walking with a bag of seed slung over his shoulder, moving through a field
- XIII) He is scattering seed throughout the field with the intent of reaping a great harvest
- As a farmer, he is scattering the seed with purpose and personal concern
 He isn't just throwing the seed anywhere, but is carefully scattering it

over the ground

- II) V4 And it happened as he sowed that some seed fell by the wayside and the birds
- III) As he scattered seed, some fell on the hardened path that bordered the field This is soil that has been hardened by foot traffic
- IV) V5-6 Some fell on stony ground where it did not have much earth and immediately

These are underlying beds of rock, covered with a shallow blanket of dirt

V) The seeds germinate quickly, but the roots can't penetrate the rock, and end up springing above ground faster than normal.

The Plants look healthy but don't have mature root systems and quickly wither

VI) V7 And some seed fell among the thorns and the thorns grew up and choked it and it

The thorns are thistle bearing weeds that choke out good seed

VII) Weeds took the space, moisture, nourishment, and sunlight from the healthy plants

The result is that the ground yielded no crop

VIII) V8 But other seed fell on good ground and yielded a crop that sprang up and yielded

This ground was fertile and receptive, able to produce a spectacular harvest

- IX) V9 And He said to them He who has ears to hear *let him hear*This is a call to listen closely to what He has to say
- X) Those who desire to know Him will be those who seek Him

 He is revealed to us through His word

 Jer 29:13 You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.
- XI) Listen closely to what I have to say because if you desire to understand, you will

Your heart is soil and it can produce a beautiful garden, or a field of weeds!

He who has ears to hear let him hear:

XII) Decide that you will listen, with a heart of faith

twelve

- XIII) This is because God's word produces fruit that results in eternal life
 1 Th 2:13 And we continually thank God because, when you received the
 word of God that you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men, but as
 the true word of God--the word which is now at work in you who believe.
- I) Jesus was speaking to a great multitude which included disciples and deniers

 The religious leaders had already started to reject Him, as did many
 others
- II) These people were not given the interpretation of the parable Only those who had ears to hear were willing to listen and to understand

These were the ones that He gave an explanation

III) V10 But when He was alone *those around Him* with the twelve asked Him about the

There are those who are remaining to hear an explanation, and His

- IV) Why are you giving stories but not giving any explanation

 They all don't understand! And by the way, we don't either (V13)
- V) V11 And He said to them To you it has been given to know the mystery of the kingdom

 It has been given (granted) to you to know the mysteries of the Kingdom
- VI) You have ears to hear, and to you the mystery of the kingdom is revealed MYSTERY: Spiritual truth that previously was hidden but is now revealed

To you, salvation has been revealed and received

VII) If God were not to reveal Himself to us, we would never know Him (1 Co 2:14)

God reveals to us how to have a relationship with Him and draws us to

Himself

Mt 11:27 All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son *chooses to reveal him*.

VIII) V11 You have been given the privilege of knowing the mystery of salvation

In your embracing Me by faith you have been opened to understanding the work of God

- IX) V11b but to those who are outside all things come in parables

 To others it has not been given: They do not have saving faith

 They are blinded by unbelief and are simply not interested in what He has to say
- X) V12 So that seeing they may see and not perceive and hearing they may hear and not
- XI) He quotes Is 6:9-10: In the time of Isaiah, the Jews were rejecting the God of Israel

No matter how He called to them to repent, they refused to hear: Ultimately, they were judged

- XII) They hardened their heart to God, ignored His Word and were locked into their sin
- I) V13 He said to them do you not understand this parable? How then will you understand

Understanding this parable is the key to understanding the other parables He is giving

- II) V14 *FIRST*: The sower sows the *word*The sower is Jesus (Mt 13:37) and obviously, the word is God's word, in the gospel
- III) Jesus has been going throughout the nation teaching and preaching
 Great multitudes from Galilee, Jerusalem, Idumea, beyond the Jordan,
 Tyre and Sidon are following Him
- IV) As they come to hear Him, He preaches to them and He teaches them

 As the Sower, He is doing this with intent, covering the ground with the seed

Ps 126:5-6 Those who sow in tears Shall reap in joy. He who continually goes forth weeping, bearing seed for sowing, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him

V) You men and many of you listening have heard what I have taught You have become followers of Mine but have seen that not all have done

This is the explanation as to why they have rejected Me

SO

VI) V15 These are the ones by the wayside where the word is sown When they hear

Why do they reject the word? Satan runs interference and takes away the word

VII) Stereotypes, distractions, pride, bitterness, love of the world and sin hardens them

They hear the gospel but reject it having no desire to listen and be saved

unbelief

VIII) This would specifically point out the Pharisees and other religious leaders
They were trapped in their religious traditions and refused the grace and love of God
Satan has used this and has blinded them spiritually, encouraging

IX) V16-17 These likewise are the ones sown on stony ground who when they hear the word

Stony ground is similar to the wayside but is actually hidden more deeply

There is a thin layer of dirt that is covering the hardness of the soil

X) These people hear the gospel and emotionally seem to embrace its message Externally they appear wonderfully saved, but in their hearts, they remain hard in sin

Under the surface is unbelief and a lack of repentance

- XI) They are the Victims of easy believism

 They hear a shallow message that eliminates cost, sacrifice or troubles
- I) They can show up at church, bible studies, go to retreats, and even serve On the outside, they appear to be genuine believers
- II) When tribulation or persecution arises, they are immediately made to stumble Because they have not truly repented, when trouble arises they abandon faith

They never had a deep love for Jesus or hunger for righteousness, and fall away

III) They had no true conversion, although it may take years for this to show They get disappointed in God and when hurt, they turn away from Him

IV) A.W. TOZER: "The Incredible Christian":

thorns

If God sets out to make you an unusual Christian He is not likely to be as gentle as He is usually pictured by the popular teachers. A sculptor does not use a manicure set to reduce the rude, unshapely marble to a thing of beauty. The saw, the hammer and the chisel are cruel tools, but without them the rough stone must remain forever formless and unbeautiful. To do His supreme work of grace within you He will take from your heart everything you love most. Everything you trust in will go from you. Piles of ashes will lie where your most precious treasures used to be...

Only a genuine believer will remain under such conditions

V) V18-19 Now these are the ones sown among thorns; they are the ones who hear the word

Once again, the soil appears good but within it are seeds of weeds and

When the seed is watered and cared for, the seeds of the thorns also sprout

- VI) These are the double-minded hearers of the word

 These include Jesus in their way of talk, but not in their way of life

 Their first love remains the World: Pride, position, possessions all reign supreme
- VII) They are overwhelmed with the deceitfulness of riches and their desires for other things

The love for the world dominates any love they might have for His word Mt. 6:24 No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money.

VIII) Their love for this world chokes off any longing for heaven and they abandon Jesus

In every case: The seed is fine, it is the person who is callused

IX) V20 But these are the ones sown on good ground, those who hear the word accept it and

This soil is not filled with unbelief, and he is productive in the kingdom of God

- X) NOTICE: Each one produces according to its own capacity

 Not are equally productive, because not all are equally sold out to the

 Lord
- I) Some just want to get in to heaven, others want to come in Victoriously and fruitfully

Jn 15:5 I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing.

II) Not everyone listened to what Jesus said

We need to remember that though He spoke to multitudes, in the end few followed Him

1 Co 15:6 tells us that after Jesus' resurrection His number of followers were a little more than five hundred

III) What happened to the rest?
