- I) V1-3 INTRO: Better is a dry morsel with quietness than a house full of feasting with strife
- II) A DRY MORSEL: Speaks of a crumb of dried out bread HOUSE FULL OF FEASTING: Can speak of portions of offerings that are eaten
- III) THOUGHT: It is better to eat a simple meal in peace then to eat well, with strife
- IV) Many can understand this when considering family get togethers during holidays Pr 15:17 Better *is* a dinner of herbs where love is, Than a fatted calf with hatred
- V) V2 A WISE: Servant will rule over a son who causes shame and will share an inheritance When the will is read, he may get a portion of the inheritance
- VI) A wise servant is honored by inheriting the master's goods, taking the place of a bad son Pr 11:29 He who troubles his own house will inherit the wind, And the fool will be servant to the wise of heart.
- VII) V3 THE REFINING POT: Is for silver and the furnace for gold but the Lord tests that hearts God will test a persons faith through afflictions, *revealing sin* so it can be forsaken
- VIII) KEY: This refining process purifies our lives

Is 48:10 I have refined you, but not as silver; I have tested you in the furnace of affliction 1 Pe 1:6-7 In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ

- IX) V4 AN EVILDOER: Gives heed to false lips; a liar listens eagerly to a spiteful tongue EVILDOER: A malicious, spiteful person who enjoys bringing trouble to others
- X) THIS PERSON: Listens to other evil people and finds their counsel to his liking
 This is because they are both evil so the advice will be appealing
- XI) V4b A LIAR: Listens eagerly to a spiteful tongue Because he is a liar, he delights in spiteful things said about others
- XII) Wicked people find lies and spiteful comments about other people appealing
 People are just as guilty of gossip if they listen to it
 Ps 101:5 Whoever secretly slanders his neighbor, Him I will destroy; The one who has

Ps 101:5 Whoever secretly slanders his neighbor, Him I will destroy; The one who has a haughty look and a proud heart, Him I will not endure

- V5 HE: Who mocks the poor reproaches his Maker; he who is glad at calamity will not go It is never right to mock someone who is poor Some make fun of the way they look, where they live, what they drive
- II) THEY ARE PRECIOUS: To the Lord
- III) V5b HE: Who is glad at calamity will not go unpunished

 Do not rejoice when somebody goes through a disaster and loses everything
- IV) This is the sin that reveals a very petty and spiteful heart
 Pr 14:31 He who oppresses the poor reproaches his Maker, But he who honors Him has
 mercy on the needy.
- V) V6 CHILDREN'S CHILDREN: Are the crown of old men and the glory of children is their Ps 127:3 Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD, The fruit of the womb is a reward.
- VI) Grandfather's are blessed to see their grandchildren following their footsteps
 They are blessed to know that the reputation of the family will be untarnished
- VII) AND THE: Glory of children is their father

 To have a wise, respected, and godly father makes a child proud
- VIII) IN THE END: Remember that it is your children who will decide your later years!
- IX) V7 EXCELLENT SPEECH: Is not becoming to a fool much less lying lips to a prince Excellent (Superior) speech (language) is not becoming (beautiful, seemly) to a fool Lofty, or superior speech does not suit a fool's nature, and lying should not suit a prince
- X) PRINCE: Gentlemen, people of superior upbreeding and morals; impeccable character Rulers are to live according to a high standard, a code of honor
- XI) V8 A PRESENT: Is a precious stone in the eyes of its possessor; wherever he turns he Interesting: Those who use bribery often meet with success

 From the viewpoint of the one giving bribes, it works!
- XII) JUDGMENT: Is to remain impartial

Ex 23:8 You shall take no bribe, for a bribe blinds the discerning and perverts the words of the righteous.

- I) V9 HE: Who covers a transgression seeks love but he who repeats a matter separates the Friendship requires the ability to forget wrongs done to them
- II) Love for the friend motivates them to take the better course, preserving friendship 1 Pe 4:8 Above all things have fervent love for one another, for love will cover a multitude of sins

1 Co 13:5 (love) thinks (catalogues) no evil

- III) NOTICE: He who repeats a matter separates friends
 If you keep bringing it up, you end up losing the friend
 Some things should remain buried, so do not rake up old problems
- IV) V10 REPROOF: Is more effective for a wise man than a hundred blows on a fool
 Correction benefits the one desiring to learn
 A fool, on the other hand can receive physical punishment and still insist they are right
 Pr 9:8 Do not correct a scoffer, lest he hate you; Rebuke a wise man, and he will love you
- V) V11 AN: Evil man seeks only rebellion therefore a cruel messenger will be sent against him

You reap what you sow

- VI) V12 LET A MAN: Meet a bear robbed of her cubs rather than a fool in his folly POINT: A fool is more dangerous that a beast acting reasonably A fool in his folly: Driving on drugs, or drunk, or angry and with a weapon
- VII) V13 WHOEVER: Rewards evil for good, evil will not depart from his house Again, he ultimately will reap what he has sown
 This kind of person most certainly has produced an environment that will result in this Ro 12:17 Repay no one evil for evil. Have regard for good things in the sight of all men.
- VIII) V14 THE: Beginning of strife is like releasing water therefore stop contention before a A small leak in a hose can burst open with enough pressure POINT: Stop a fight before it begins: Be a peacemaker Pr 20:3 It is honorable for a man to stop striving, Since any fool can start a quarrel.
- IX) V15 HE: Who justifies the wicked and he who condemns the just both of them alike are an God hates injustice, from calling the guilty righteous to calling the righteous guilty Pr 24:23-24 These things also belong to the wise: It is not good to show partiality in judgment. He who says to the wicked, "You are righteous," Him the people will curse; Nations will abhor him.

I) V16 WHY: Is there in the hand of a fool the purchase price of wisdom since he has no heart

Why does a person try to buy wisdom when they have no brains? You pay the Tuition for school, but they have no desire for an education

II) V17 A FRIEND: Loves at all times and a brother is born for adversity
A friend is also ones brother: When hard times hit, they are there
Eccl 4:9-12 Two are better than one, Because they have a good reward for their labor.
For if they fall, one will lift up his companion. But woe to him who is alone when he falls, For he has no one to help him up. Again, if two lie down together, they will keep warm; But how can one be warm alone? Though one may be overpowered by another, two can withstand him. And a threefold cord is not quickly broken.

III) V18 A MAN: Devoid of understanding shakes hands in a pledge and becomes surety for his

Don't foolishly co sign for a loan

Pr 22:26-27 Do not be one of those who shakes hands in a pledge, One of those who is surety for debts; If you have nothing with which to pay, Why should he take away your bed from under you?

IV) V19 HE: Who loves transgression loves strife and he who exalts his gate seeks destruction

If you love sin you also love living without peace, as you will always argue with others

- V) V19b EXALTS: His gate can have two meanings
 FIRST: Making his home outwardly magnificent, pretending to be rich and great
 This would be evidence of pride and arrogance, revealing his sin
- VI) OR: It could be in reference to your mouth, and this would refer to arrogant speech Pr 29:22 An angry man stirs up strife, And a furious man abounds in transgression.
- VII) V20 HE: Who has a deceitful heart *finds no good* and he who has a perverse tongue falls Wicked ways and wicked words will eventually produce trouble The wicked one is crooked, and his plans will only result in problems and calamity
- VIII) V21 HE WHO: Begets a scoffer does so to his sorrow and the father of a fool has no joy A godly father has sorrow when the child is morally and religiously senseless 3 Jn 4 I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth.
- IX) V22 A MERRY HEART: Does good like medicine but a broken spirit dries the bones

- V23 A WICKED MAN: Accepts a bribe behind the back to pervert the ways of justice Correct judges or political officials accept bribes and twists justice
- II) V24 WISDOM: Is in the sight of him who has understanding but the eyes of a fool are on the

Those who are wise keep the goal before them and run for the prize
Phil 3:13-14 Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do,
forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead,
I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus

- III) V25 A FOOLISH SON: Is a grief to his father and bitterness to her who bore him
- IV) V26 ALSO: To punish the righteous is not good nor to strike princes for their uprightness It is always a mistake to punish the innocent
- V) V27 HE: Who has knowledge spares his words and a man of understanding is of a calm There are those who hate the sound of silence so they must speak Eccl 5:3 And a fool's voice is known by his many words
- VI) The wise restrain their speaking and control their behavior

 Jas 1:19-20 So then, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath; for the wrath of man does not produce the righteousness of God.
- VII) V28 EVEN A FOOL: Is counted wise when he holds his peace when he shuts his lips
 The fool looks wise because he says nothing
 He appears wise and contemplative because he doesn't say something
