- I) V1-5 INTRO: For we know that if our earthly house this tent is destroyed we have a Paul just wrote of some of the struggles that he endured for the Gospel's sake HE HAD WRITTEN
- II) 4:16 Our outward (material) bodies are perishing (changing for the worse)
 Paul's body wasted away under his trials, being often threatened with death
- III) In spite of this, his *inward man* was being renewed day by day

 The inward, unseen person can grow strong and be renewed daily by the Spirit

 Paul was gaining spiritual strength, purity of spirit, and comfort daily
- IV) Part of the way that his *inward man* was renewed came through his afflictions Paul's mind and faith grew, and God's truth became much clearer

 IN OTHER WORDS
- V) The afflictions he endured developed his spiritual depth
- VI) In 4:17 Paul went on to contrast the momentary with the eternal

 By doing this he contrasted what he called light weight with the truly weighty

 HIS POINT
- VII) Christian suffering, no matter how intense or lengthy, occurs only in this life

 These afflictions remove our grip from the world, and make us long for Jesus
- VIII) 4:18 we do not look at the things, which are seen, but at the things which are not Our vision is not locked on to the present conditions, but on eternity

 Our goal goes beyond what we now see, but is fixed on heaven, and eternity

 HE CONTINUES HIS THOUGHT
- IX) V1 For we know that if our earthly house this tent is destroyed we have a building Paul now explains what has fueled his faith and hope for the future He identifies what has made him bold and courageous in the face of troubles
- X) What has fueled his life and produced in him such a firm devotion to Jesus What has given him the calmness to endure and strength to go through pain HE TELLS US
- XI) V1 We know that if our earthly house this tent is destroyed, we have a building We know: We are confident about our future because of His work on our behalf
- XII) We know if our earthly house, this tent is destroyed we have a building from God His thought: Though his body is perishing, he has something waiting for him

- His body may be perishing, but God has prepared something better for him
 He will receive a body that will never suffer death or pain again
 He has a glorified, resurrection body, one made suitable for heaven
 DEVELOP
- II) It is interesting how he said If our earthly house is destroyed

 It seems Paul once again made it clear that he would be raptured in his lifetime

 It is possible he would die, but not necessarily inevitable

 JESUS COULD RAPTURE HIM
- Ill) The expectation of the rapture drove him to live in preparation of being with Jesus
 The rapture is a way of describing how Jesus will take the church to be with Him
 1 Th 4:16-17 For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the
 voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first.
 Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to
 meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord
- IV) Paul and other NT writers expected Jesus' return to be imminent
 Because this is true, we are to be prepared to see Him at any moment
 Ro 13:12 The night is far spent, the day is at hand
 1 Co 7:29 But this I say brethren, the time is short
 Phil 4:5 Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand.
 Jas 5:8 You also be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand.
 Rev 22:20 He who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming quickly."
 Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus!
- V) This is something that he had already taught the Corinthians in his first letter 1 Co 15:51-53 Behold, I tell you a mystery: We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed-- in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality.
- VI) Paul knew that he was receiving a resurrection body

 This meant he wasn't concerned about eternity though his body was wasting away

 One day he would be resurrected and have a transformed body

 1 Jn 3:2 Beloved, we are now children of God, and what we will be has not yet

been revealed. We know that when Christ appears, we will be like Him, for we will see Him as He is.

- I) He uses the word tent as a picture of the body as the dwelling place of our soul This was a common image during his day 2 Pe 1:13-14 Yes, I think it is right, as long as I am in this tent, to stir you up by reminding you knowing that shortly I must put off my tent, just as our Lord Jesus Christ showed me.
- II) The expectation of being with Jesus is what fueled Paul to serve faithfully
 Titus 2:11-14 For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men,
 teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly,
 righteously, and godly in the present age, looking for the blessed hope and glorious
 appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for us, that He
 might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself His own special people,
 zealous for good works
- III) V1 Even if our earthly house this tent is destroyed (torn down; dismantled)
 This reveals the source of his peace and ability to endure afflictions
 He looks past what is presently happening, fixing his eyes on future blessings

 THOUGHT
- IV) As a tentmaker, Paul would make shelters

 He valued the tents that would shelter temporary dwellers
- V) These tents that housed temporary dwellers would be taken down
 God is preparing a permanent dwelling place: a house that won't be taken down
 Our earthly bodies are temporary, but our glorified body will be permanent
- VI) V2-3 For in this we groan earnestly desiring to be clothed with our habitation In this body we live a life filled with afflictions, infirmities, injuries, and fatigue
- VII) Much of this is understood by those who are aging (silver or seasoned saints)

 Our bodies are growing older, and we deal with things we didn't expect

 Men live to 76, women to 83

INTERESTINGLY

- VIII) Some people have a difficult time embracing the reality of aging They still consider themselves **cool** and **young**
- IX) Some 60's/70's music groups became aware of this and re-released their songs They changed the titles and the lyrics to accommodate their aging audience

WE ARE AGING, BUT ALSO LONGING TO BE WITH JESUS

II) This increases our longing to be removed from here to be with Him Phil. 3:20 Our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ

HABITATION FROM HEAVEN

- III) V3 if indeed having been clothed we shall not be found naked When resurrected, we will have the appropriate garment: resurrection body
- V4 We who are in this tent groan (express longing) being burdened not because
 We do not want to just die, longing to escape afflictions and sorrows
 We groan because we want to be in glory with Him, with His abundance
 Ps 16:11 You will show me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; At Your right hand are pleasures forevermore.

THE FACT IS

V) We can get to the point where we just want to throw in the towel

At one point, even Job simply desired to die and be done with it

Job 6:8-9 Oh that I might have my request, that God would grant me the thing

that I long for! That it would please God to crush me, that He would loose His hand and cut me off!

KEY

- VI) Paul is saying that we do not simply want to die, but we long to be with Him
- VII) V5 Now He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who also has given us We have been prepared to be clothed, not in weakness and death, but in life

- I) Everything that led up to this: Jesus' death, our redemption, our being born again, His gifts and the grace we have received is working to this end: Eternal life with Jesus HOW CAN HE BE SURE
- II) V5 This is not something Paul is wishing for: it is something guaranteed by God He has given us the Spirit as a guarantee Guarantee: Money given as a down payment that the full amount will be paid
- III) The Spirit is the pledge of the heavenly inheritance that is completely received when we are glorified in heaven
- IV) It is God's guarantee that we are redeemed and have a future with Him 2 Co 1:22 (God) also has sealed us and given us the Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee Eph 1:13-14 In Him you also trusted, after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in whom also, having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, to the praise of His glory.
- V) The work of the Spirit guarantees our hope of a heavenly body, suitable for heaven Because He is faithful, we will not fail to be clothed with a new, resurrection body This is future glory, when we are with Him and He removes our fear of death
- VI) V6 Therefore we are always confident knowing that while we are at home in the The Spirit gives us internal confidence: We are assured in Christ, constantly This is one good reason to seek the Lord and to walk in His Spirit
- VII) When we live in fear, we are quenching the work of the Holy Spirit
 This is because living in uncertainty produces an anxiety filled life
 Fear motivated anxiety produces internal torment
- VIII) The remedy for this is walking in the Spirit and clinging to God's promises We can have confidence because God has promised us and guarantees it
- IX) Because this is true, we do not need to live in fear of judgment any longer This is because fear and love cannot co-exist
- X) Because we have been **saved**, we can have confidence on the day of judgment We have the Spirit, and He has given us a revelation of God's love in salvation

- I) This is a perfect love, and this perfect love drives out fear (of judgment)

 1 Jn 4:18 There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love
- II) Satan uses fear to keep people in bondage
 He inspires us to fear losing possessions, comforts, reputations, even our lives
- III) Jesus came to free us from this fear, especially of fear of death and final judgment Heb 2:14-15 Now since the children have flesh and blood, He too shared in their humanity, so that by His death He might destroy him who holds the power of death, that is, the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death.
- IV) Satan uses fear, but God draws with love, mercy, and grace
- V) Fear and love don't co-exist: If there is a concern *for* final judgment, love is absent A Christian who fears final judgment reveals a concern for *personal judgment*, which reveals an imperfect understanding of salvation
- VI) Perfect love literally drives fear out so that fear does not exist in real love
 Perfect love is a love that delivers us from concern for our future
 It produces mature confidence in God and His promise of salvation
- VII) It is the result of genuine conversion and is founded on the work of His Spirit Ro 8:11 And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit, who lives in you.

Ro 8:16 The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God NOTICE

- VIII) V6 He says knowing that while we are at home in the body we are absent At home means occupying our body: dwelling here in a temporary condition
- IX) To be here, even temporarily is to be absent from the actual presence of the Lord Absent: While he is on earth he is actually away from his real home or country It speaks of his longing to be with the Lord and to leave this temporary place

 Phil 1:21-23 For to me to live is Christ and to die is gain. But if I live on in the flesh, this will mean fruit from my labor; yet what I shall choose I cannot tell. For I am hard pressed between the two, having a desire to depart and be with Christ, which is far better

- V7 For we walk by faith, not by sight (by what we see)
 We walk in faith, trusting in God's promises and informed internally by His Spirit
 This internal drive of faith has produced a great confidence that God is with us
- II) The Spirit gives us confidence that God redeemed us, and heaven is our home In matters of faith, seeing is not believing: Believing is seeing
- III) In the resurrection of Lazarus Jesus had said <u>Lazarus would rise again</u>
 Jesus had raised others from the dead: The widow of Nain's son (Lu 7:11-17) and
 Jairus' daughter (Lu 8:42)
 He was clearly stating that Lazarus <u>would also rise</u>
- IV) When Jesus came to Lazarus' tomb, He commanded the stone to be removed Martha immediately told Jesus the stench would be terrible Jn 11:40 Jesus said to her Did I not say to you that if you would believe you would see the glory of God?

APPLICATION

- V) Though things are yet to be seen, we live as those who are already seeing them Heb 11:1 What is faith? It is the confident assurance that what we hope for is going to happen. It is the evidence of things we cannot yet see.
- VI) For the Christian, it is a confidence that is rooted in their relationship with God It is built on certainty that God tells the truth, and does not lie
- VII) We are confident that the moment we close our eyes here, we are with Him There is no waiting place: we go directly to be with the Lord This strengthens us to endure whatever it is that we go through
- VIII) Paul had just listed things he suffered, but this made heaven more glorious
 Nothing on earth could take his eyes off what awaited him in heaven
 Phil 3:8 Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the
 knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and
 count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ
- IX) V9 Therefore we make it *our aim* whether present or absent to be pleasing to Him *Our aim*: Our earnest ambition; that which we strive for; our zealous pursuit The thought of seeing Jesus spurred Paul to live a life well pleasing to Him

- I) This was his ambition and purpose; this is what he expended his energy on Ps 27:4 *One thing* I have desired of the LORD, that will I seek: That I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the LORD, and to inquire in His temple.
- II) He longed to be with the Lord because he loved Him, not just to escape

 He lived in anticipation of this and it provoked him to live for the Lord every day
- III) He knew that this life was not all that there is

 He was just passing through as a pilgrim

 1 Pe 2:11 Beloved, I beg you as sojourners and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul
- IV) V10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ that each one may Appear: To be made fully manifest; to be seen clearly; made completely visible THIS IS DEEP
- V) All will stand before the judgment seat, and everything shall be clearly seen Heb 9:27
- VI) The hidden sins and motives will be clearly revealed when Jesus judges
 Ps 90:8 You have set our iniquities (depravities) before you, our secret sins in the light of your presence.

Eccl 12:14 For God will bring every deed into judgment, along with every hidden thing, whether good or evil.

Ro 2:16 this is the message I proclaim—that the day is coming when God, through Christ Jesus, will judge everyone's secret life.

VII) On that day all that was secret, for good or for evil, will be revealed

1 Co 4:5 Therefore judge nothing before the appointed time; wait until the Lord comes. He will bring to light what is hidden in darkness and will expose the motives of the heart. At that time each will receive their praise from God.

NOTICE

- VIII) We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ

 The unsaved appear before the judgment seat and receive just punishment

 The saved will receive rewards for faithful service
- IX) This speaks of rewards that are received or lost depending on service to the Lord

I) WE KNOW THIS

Because Christians are saved by grace, we will not come into final judgment Jn 5:24 I tell you the truth, those who listen to my message and believe in God who sent me have eternal life. They will never be condemned for their sins, but they have already passed from death into life.

- II) Salvation is a gift, but there are rewards for faithfulness in the Christian life Receiving rewards from the Lord should be a great motivator for service to Him
- III) There are proper rewards that believers desire to receive
 We serve out of thankfulness but by His grace, we also receive reward
 Rev 22:12 Behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to render to
 every man according to what he has done
- IV) The judgment seat is called the Bema seat of Christ
 The word Bema is taken from the Isthmian games, which were like the Olympics
- V) The contestants competed for prizes under the close watch of officials
 If they competed properly, abiding by the rules, they could win a prize
 1 Co 9:25 Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do
 it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever.

IN THIS CONTEXT

- VI) The bema seat is the place where every work comes into judgment
 Mt 16:27 For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with his
 angels, and then He will reward each person according to what he has done.
 Eph. 6:8 you know that the Lord will reward everyone for whatever good he does
- VII) This Bema seat judgment will occur after the rapture
 We have glorified bodies, are with the Lord, and come before the Bema seat
 Rev 19:8 When Jesus returns with His bride, she is already wearing her fine linen

 AGAIN
- VIII) The Bema seat is the place of reward, not of eternal judgment (White throne)
 The rewards are mentioned in Scripture but not given in detail
 There are crowns: The Incorruptible crown (permanent) 1 Co 9:25, The crown of rejoicing (witnessing crown—Phil 4:1), Crown of Life (Jas 1:12) for enduring trials, crown of righteousness (2 Ti 4:8—faithfully serving as we waited for Him to return), and the crown of glory (1 Pe 5:4—given to faithful pastors)
