Get Back on the Road

Mark 10:46–52 (CSB)

The Gospel of Mark: Suffering Servant and Son of God

Main Idea: Because the Son of God stops for men who cry out, there's no road too broken and no past too far gone for Him to get us moving again.

Movement 1 — The Road We _____ On (vv. 46–48)

Men often get close to movement but aren't part of it. We weren't built for the shoulder — we were built for the road.

- A. We _____ for the Shoulder
 - We can't finish the race from the shoulder. — Hebrews 12:1
- B. We _____ to the Wrong Voices
 - The enemy's favorite tactic isn't destruction — it's distraction.
- C. We Forget the _____ of a Cry
 - Strength starts with surrender. God doesn't need perfect prayers — just honest ones. — Psalm 18:6

Key Thought: You weren't made to sit in the garage — you were made to move.

Movement 2 — The Road Jesus _____ On (vv. 49–50)

Jesus — in the middle of His journey to the cross — stops for one man's cry. He doesn't rush past your pain — He stops for you.

- A. Jesus Stops When Others _____ On
 - When others move past your pain, Jesus moves toward it. — Psalm 34:18
- B. When Jesus _____, Everything Changes
 - The same crowd that said, "Be quiet" now says, "Get up!" His voice doesn't just inform — it transforms.
- C. Throwing Off the _____ — Faith in Motion
 - Faith moves before sight. We let go of what's comfortable to grab hold of what's new. — Hebrews 12:1

Key Thought: He doesn't stop just to comfort — He stops to call.

Movement 3 — The Road We're _____ to Walk (vv. 51–52)

When Jesus restores vision, it's so we can follow.

When Jesus opens your eyes, everything changes — your purpose, your priorities, your people. — A.W. Tozer

Key Thought: Don't just be grateful for sight — be faithful on the road.

“⁴⁶ They came to Jericho. And as he was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting by the road. ⁴⁷ When he heard that it was Jesus the Nazarene, he began to cry out, ‘Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!’ ⁴⁸ Many warned him to keep quiet, but he was crying out all the more, ‘Have mercy on me, Son of David!’”

⁴⁹ Jesus stopped and said, ‘Call him.’ So they called the blind man and said to him, ‘Have courage! Get up; he’s calling for you.’ ⁵⁰ He threw off his coat, jumped up, and came to Jesus. ⁵¹ Then Jesus answered him, ‘What do you want me to do for you?’ ‘Rabboni,’ the blind man said to him, ‘I want to see.’ ⁵² Jesus said to him, ‘Go, your faith has saved you.’ Immediately he could see and began to follow Jesus on the road.”
