Finding Joy in Difficult Circumstances - Philippians1:12-26

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Paul provides us with a view of Authentic Christianity in vs. 12-26

Philippians 1:12-14

- His imprisonment was actually advancing not hindering the gospel.
- God had opened the door for Paul to preach the gospel to the Roman Military (palace guard).
- Paul was also able to preach to his fellow Christian Leaders in Rome
- Paul's example of faith in persecution gave other believers fearlessness
- Ex. Nero was the current Emperor in Rome during Paul's imprisonment
- In the face of adversity Paul chose to believe in God

Philippians 1:15-18

- Some preached from a position of envy and strife as they were jealous of Paul's ministry
- Their motives are between them and God
- Paul found a spirit of Joy as they were preaching the gospel and the Word of God was spreading

Philippians 1:19-20

- He was encouraged because of their prayers and the filling of the Holy Spirit
- Paul had confidence no matter the circumstance

Philippians 1:21-26

 To live is, to die is 	
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- Each situation is a blessing from Christ
- Paul desired to help his fellow believers' progress in their faith

12 Now I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has actually resulted in the advance of the gospel, ¹³ so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard, and to everyone else, that my imprisonment is in the cause of Christ. 14 Most of the brothers in the Lord have gained confidence from my imprisonment and dare even more to speak the message fearlessly.

¹⁵To be sure, some preach Christ out of envy and strife, but others out of good will. 16These do so out of love, knowing that I am appointed for the defense of the gospel; ¹⁷the others proclaim Christ out of rivalry, not sincerely, seeking to cause me anxiety in my imprisonment. 18What does it matter? Just that in every way, whether out of false motives or true, Christ is proclaimed. And in this I rejoice. Yes, and I will rejoice...

19 because I know this will lead to my deliverance through your prayers and help from the Spirit of Jesus Christ. ²⁰ My eager expectation and hope is that I will not be ashamed about anything, but that now as always, with all boldness, Christ will be highly honored in my body, whether by life 'or by death.

²¹ For me, to live is Christ, to die is gain. ²² Now if I live on in the flesh, this means fruitful work for me; and I don't know which one I should choose. ²³ I am pressured by both. I have the desire to depart and be with Christ—which is far better— 24 but to remain in the flesh is more necessary for you. ²⁵ Since I am persuaded of this, I know that I will remain and continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶ so that, because of me, your confidence may grow in Christ Jesus when I come to you again.


